In last week's Gospel, Jesus predicts, for the second time, His passion and crucifixion. The first time He did so was in Mk 8:31. However, the disciples "did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him." (Mk 9:32)

When Jesus asked them what they were arguing about, the disciples "remained silent." (Mk 9:34) In both cases, the disciples were unwilling to communicate with Jesus. What we're they afraid of? Maybe, they did not want to be called "Satan" like Peter, or they were too ashamed to let Jesus know what they were arguing about. Nevertheless, in last week's passage the disciples did not want to reveal themselves to the Lord. They wanted to be hidden.



This "hiddenness" is seen in the Book of Genesis as well. When Adam and Eve ate the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil - the fruit they were not supposed to eat - they first covered themselves out of shame and then hid themselves from God. Why were they hiding? Maybe, they were afraid to anger God or to be punished by God. Often, as Catholics we may share the fear that Adam, Eve, and the disciples had - the fear of revealing ourselves fully to the Lord - the good and the bad aspects of our natures and actions, especially the bad. What if He gets angry at us? What if He punishes us? What if we are not good enough for His love? It seems very reasonable to be afraid.

However, I do not think Jesus wants us to have this kind of fear. One of my favorite writers, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, said that we can often misrepresent who God is in our lives. However, Jesus comes to cast away the misrepresentation of God and reveal to us who He truly is.

In last week's Gospel, Jesus, in placing a child in the midst of the disciples and putting his arms around the child (Mk 9:36), reveals to us that God is a loving Father and we are His beloved children.

If we see God as a policeman determined to catch those who fall and to punish them, then all of us who have fallen want to hide from Him. However, if we see Him as a loving Father who is constantly seeking His children in order to extend His transforming love, then we can confidently and joyfully approach Him with any questions, doubts, and faults.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, how do you see God? Is He a source of fear or love?


