

+ Dear Friends:

As we embark on this third Sunday of Advent, I want to share with you this wonderful passage a priest friend of mine wrote. I think you will find his words both comforting and inspirational.

Praying with Hope

"And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three," writes St. Paul, "and the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor 13:13). I sometimes wonder if Paul had a hard time choosing the "greatest" among these three gifts from God. Certainly, I'm a big fan of love! But, after all, without faith we have no foundation. And, to that end, without hope we would have no future.

Over thirty years ago, as a Jesuit novice, I read something that upended my notion of hope, which until then I had taken for optimism — as in "Don't worry! It will all work out!" The comment I read was from Pedro Arrupe, the Superior General of the Society of Jesus from 1965 to 1983. He said, "I am, quite happy to be called an optimist, but my optimism is not of the utopian variety. It is based on hope. What is an optimist? I can answer for myself in a very simple fashion: He or she is a person who has the conviction that God knows, can do, and will do what is best." In other words, hope is grounded in God. It is not simply having a good attitude, as important as it is. It is based on a relationship with the Source of All Being, who comes to us as the Savior whose birth we await during this season of Advent.

Hope is also a gift, something we must pray for. Even in our dark moments, when it seems like God has forgotten us (which God never does) we are invited to pray for hope. And in that very prayer, we deepen our relationship with God, and again find hope. (Father James Martin, S.J.)

As many of you know, I like to walk around our beautiful campus to check on things. I think taking walks is something I learned as a young boy with my Dad. He loved to take my siblings and I out for a walk after dinner, when we were small. It was great because sometimes we would run into a neighbor and get a little news. Sometimes we would see something new in somebody's yard like a new car, or a new baby carriage, or a new addition. Something was always going on, and those walks kept us up-to-date. The reason I mention this is to tell you that I was thinking the same thing about our beloved St. E's.

In this season of preparing the way, Joe Costanzo set up the crèche on the front lawn of the rectory. Laurie and Dan Kocher and all their helpers just wrapped up this year's Giving Tree. Cathy Ingrasci is working on her Advent reflection for both men and women this year. Keri Rigoli and the Christmas decorating committee are planning the seasonal sparkle for church, and Stacie Yao is rehearsing both choirs and the new addition of the little children's bell ringer ensemble!

Soon there will be two fantastic mosaics arriving – one dedicated to Saint Elizabeth and one dedicated to Saint Francis. We have participated in many outreach programs with the Knights of Columbus, and our friends at Oasis and Father English in Paterson. We are also making our homes ready for family gatherings with decorating traditions and cherished recipes being stirred, whipped, and sliced!

By the end of my walk, I came to the heartwarming conclusion that it is *all* to welcome Jesus, the Prince of Peace. He is our light and our hope. May we never doubt it!
