



My dear friends at St. Elizabeth's,

For this week's bulletin article, I decided to go into the archives and pull out a homily I gave six years ago. I decided to use a portion of it because the message is as relevant today as it was when I first gave the homily. I hope you enjoy it!

In last week's Gospel, we, along with the crowds and His disciples, ascended the mountain near the Sea of Galilee to hear Jesus' great Sermon on the Mount and His discourse on the Beat-

itudes. This week, we remain on the mountain top as Jesus continues with His Sermon on the Mount, to hear additional instructions about the true essence of what it means to be His disciple, through the metaphors of salt and light.

Today's gospel passage has very deep significance for me because it reminds me of a time nearly 21 years ago when I found myself on the top of a rolling hill at Downsview Park near Toronto, Canada. I was one of over 800,000 pilgrims who had come to see Pope John Paul II for Evening Prayer and for Mass the following day as part of World Youth Day 2002. Just picture in your mind's eye a peaceful sea of humanity across the rolling hills as far as you can see – mostly young adults with their colorful flags and banners of their countries and home parishes flapping in the breeze.

The Pope himself seemed to grasp the significance of the situation in his closing homily when he told us Christ was speaking the same words to us on the hillside near Toronto as He did to his disciples on a hillside near the Sea of Galilee. These same words have echoed in the hearts of His disciples across time and space for over 2,000 years, and they speak to us – to you and to me - today on this hillside of St. Elizabeth's in Wyckoff. To live the beatitudes and to be a disciple of Christ does not mean we are just *like* salt or just *like* light. No! Christ tells his disciple and us today is that "YOU *ARE* the salt of the earth." "YOU *ARE* the light of the world."

In ancient times, salt was essential for life and was considered extremely valuable. It was used as a food preservative and seasoning to make food more tasty and flavorful. Christ telling His disciples and us today, to be "salt", means we are to flavor the world with the power of God's love; to give flavor to the lives of others, especially the poor, the marginalized and vulnerable; and to give flavor to the Gospel - the Good News of Jesus Christ - in our families, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, and our communities by the witness of our very lives.

Light is another powerful element which gives warmth and illumination. It does so, not for itself, but like salt, it is to be given away to others. In the ancient world, without a light or a lamp there could be no guests to be entertained, no activities or socializing at night — only sleep and darkness and, perhaps, despair. To "BE" light means to flavor the world with joy as a beacon of hope by drawing others into the community of faith. True discipleship is a light that bursts forth through the darkness, shining not on oneself but upon others.

May each of us scatter the darkness of the world by being salt and light in the way we love others!

R.C.I.A.—Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is designed to welcome adults into our Catholic faith. Preparation is a year-long ongoing process culminating at the Easter Vigil Mass. The goal is to receive the Sacraments of Baptism (for non-Christians), Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. IS RCIA FOR YOU or SOME-ONE YOU KNOW? Do you know someone or are you someone who is interested in becoming Catholic? Are you Catholic but have not yet received all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)? The RCIA is a process of prayer, reflection, and learning that allows for the continual discernment of God's will in our lives. Candidates include: Non-baptized adults who wish to enter the Catholic Church, baptized adult Christians of another denomination (i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Presbyterian) who wish to continue their Christian faith in the Catholic Church, adult baptized Catholics who have not completed he Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) and wish to do so. 
