

Dearly Beloved in Christ,

Introduction to Tenebrae: This year we again are presenting the Lenten Service called Tenebrae which is the Latin word for darkness or shadows. It's based on an early Christian service and

several ancient - pre 4th century - Good Friday traditions. The service asks us to reflect on our relationship with God, our Father, and how He, through Jesus, brings new meaning to a human being's life. It is

to help you understand - and feel - the extent of God's love for humanity - from the

distant past to and through today.

The structure of the service has four components including the Seven Last Words. Music and slides match the words and the other sections of the service.

Service length is about 45 minutes and is offered in a darkened church. The congregation participates in the service – gently – and in a manner that you should find relevant".

Please come - it can help you relate to what Jesus went through as a human being and how we, as His disciples and followers of His teachings, experience the 21st century version of His treatment.

The service will be on Good Friday evening, April 7th and its starts at 7:00 PM.



ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS 2023

1. The days of both Fast & Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted and (2) smaller meals which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18-59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- The obligation to observe the laws of Fast & Abstinence "substantially" or as whole is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 26, 2023 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 4, 2023.

*Canon 920. §1 All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a yea


