

My friends at St. Elizabeths,

Happy Labor Day Weekend! I hope you and your family had a safe and relaxing summer! I can't believe we are already into September and the start of a new school year!

Labor Day provides us an opportunity to enjoy time with family and friends and an opportunity to renew ourselves before returning to work or school. It is also a day of gratitude to the American worker whether they be in the farm fields, the factories, or at an office desk who have contributed to the success of our country since its found-

ing 247 years ago. We are blessed and indebted to the workers of the past, the present, and to the future generations who will carry forth the torch of American ingenuity and work ethic to make our country and world better.

Labor Day reminds me of the famous sermon, "a city on a hill" by John Winthrop in 1630 to describe how the newly formed Massachusetts Bay colony would shine as an example to the world. Ronald Reagan also loved this image of a shining city on a hill. He once said:

"... but I don't know if I ever quite communicated what I saw when I said it. But in my mind it was a tall, proud city built on rocks stronger than oceans, wind-swept, God-blessed, and teeming with people of all kinds living in harmony and peace; a city with free ports that hummed with commerce and creativity. And if there had to be city walls, the walls had doors and the doors were open to anyone with the will and the heart to get here. That's how I saw it and see it still."

As I contemplate this image of a shining city on a hill, and the hard work and contributions to society by the American worker, I am also reminded of those less fortunate, who need a hand-up. Because the circumstances of life are less fortunate for them than for you and me. Recently, Fr. Stephen asked me to chair the newly formed Stewardship Committee. This committee will make recommendations to Fr. Stephen on worthy causes to donate up to 5% of our monthly collections to charitable organizations within our surrounding area. Our first donation was to the JESPY House a nonprofit organization that enables adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to live independent lives consistent with their God given dignity. On this Labor Day, as we count our blessings and celebrate the American worker may we at St. Elizabeth be a shining city on a hill – shining for all to see in word and deeds.

R.C.I.A. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is designed to welcome adults into our Catholic faith. Preparation is a yearlong ongoing process culminating at the Easter Vigil Mass. The goal is to receive the Sacraments of Baptism (for non Christians), Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. IS RCIA FOR YOU or SOMEONE YOU KNOW? Do you know someone or are you someone who is interested in becoming Catholic? Are you Catholic but have not yet received all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)? The RCIA is a process of prayer, reflection, and learning that allows for the continual discernment of God's will in our lives. Candidates include: Non-baptized adults who wish to enter the Catholic Church, baptized adult Christians of another denomination (i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Presbyterian) who wish to continue their Christian faith in the Catholic Church, adult baptized Catholics who have not completed he Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) and wish to do so. 




