



Don't Wait!!

If you or your loved one is ill and might wish to receive the Sacrament of the Sick, PLEASE, do not wait until you are dying! We only have one priest serving two parishes.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is a ritual of healing appropriate not only for those in immediate danger of death but also for those suffering from physical, mental, or spiritual sickness. While it is often referred to as Extreme Unction or Last Rites, this is no longer the case. The "Last Rites" as we once knew them have died. The Church offers a variety of Sacraments to the Sick and Dying: reconciliation, anointing, and communion.

The Anointing of the Sick is best received as healing for the living. If you or a loved one senses the approach of death, you may request Viaticum, which is communion for the dying. Please do not wait until the final day when one may be unconscious, but rather when someone is able to fully receive the benefits of the Sacrament.

If you know you will be hospitalized for a planned surgery, contact the parish before you enter the hospital to arrange a time to celebrate the sacrament. Often the Sacrament of Anointing can be celebrated after Mass.

Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.
