Membership Retention

n the past few months I've been writing articles on recruiting, but this article is about something just as critical: retaining your current members. Sometimes we place tremendous emphasis on the members we don't have and begin to neglect the members we do have. Let us remember that while this organization is a philanthropic one, it is also a ministry to the sisters we sit next to in court meetings. So, what are we doing to minister to those already involved in CDA? More than ministering to; what are we doing to *engage* with those members?

If your members are getting bored, or dropping out from meetings, it can be discouraging but also indicative of a larger issue. Here are some steps to overcoming some typical issues in engaging with current members:

Be Active

Maybe it's time to introduce a new event to get your members' blood pumping – no, not a recruiting event, but a fellowship event to celebrate sisterhood and maybe fundraise for that charity or special project you've been eyeing. Do you see a need in your city or parish community for action? Form a CDA Task Force and put a few new faces in charge, not just the sisters who are always in charge of something. Women who don't feel their gifts are being utilized frequently lose their passion and start dropping off. So, utilize their gifts!

Be Open

In those planning meetings, do you keep the same ideas rolling around? Don't be afraid to ask your current members for new wisdom. Is there a member who frequently uses the phrase "We've ALWAYS done it this way" and who discourages new ideas from being voiced? Get rid of her? Of course not! As Pope Francis exhorts in Evangelii Gaudium, "Pastoral ministry... seeks to abandon the complacent attitude that says, 'We have always done it this way.'" Cast that thinking out! If you feel as though your member numbers are dropping off, open wide the doors to Christ and let in His Holy Spirit!

Be Positive

New ideas can present many obstacles, but obstacles were meant to be toppled over. Story time: when I was first getting my start in ministry, I went to a planning meeting with a few other Directors of Religious Education. Every time someone brought up a new idea, one of the directors (we'll call her "Debbie") would scoff and present every kind of obstacle imaginable. Little did Debbie know that each time she did that, one of us would feel defeated before we even started. It was so discouraging that many of us felt stuck; finally, it took one of our newest directors to say "There are obstacles, but so what. We're doing this for the Lord, and we can overcome whatever we need to overcome." That one positive voice changed everything, and it shut Debbie's negativity down. We proceeded to plan some powerful and meaningful activities for our children's ministries. If you have a Debbie Downer on one of your planning teams, perhaps redirect them to another task such as keeping track of budgets or to another way she excels in serving. That way, she still feels like her gifts are being utilized.

Be Bold

Sometimes we forget how big God is, so we limit what we ask from Him. We think "God has bigger fish to fry than this little thing I need." That is putting God in a box, and let me tell you, He is bigger than any box you can imagine. If you need God to intervene in your court, be bold and ASK God boldly for whatever is needed. As Jesus said, "Which one of you would hand his son a stone when he asks for a loaf of bread, or a snake when he asks for a fish?" (Matt. 7:9-10). God desires us to ASK Him in courage and in faith for the things we need. And your requests are important. We're striving to change the world for Him. Is there anything more important than that?

Wear your Catholic Daughter gear to mass, to the gym, to the grocery store, to the cleaners...Get one of those "Ask me About CDA" buttons and wear it. See #10.

6. Worship together.

Attend mass as a group, have a memorial mass, plan a patriotic rosary, lead Stations of the Cross during lent, plan a prayer service. Your visible devotion to our Lord will be noticed.

5. Find your own Calcutta.

Saint Teresa of Calcutta said that "You can find Calcutta anywhere, you only need eyes that see". Working together to provide a service builds community like nothing else does. It warms the heart of all who participate and is invaluable to the community. See #10.

4. Recruit always, Recruit all ways.

Every member's job is to recruit. Every woman you meet is a potential member. Talk about Catholic Daughters to everyone. Have your elevator speech ready to explain what makes Catholic Daughters special. See #10.

3. Have Fun.



BELL RINGING ANGELS

Once again, Our Lady Queen of the Lake, Court 2364 provided 20 bell ringing angels for the Salvation Army. "The red kettle has been an American icon for 125 years. From Thanksgiving to Christmas Eve, the ubiquitous buckets can be found outside thousands of storefronts in small towns and big cities across the country." Have you ever wondered who started the red kettle tradition, where, and why?

The next day, McFee secured permission to place a brass urn at the Oakland ferry landing. Beside the pot, he placed a sign that read, "Keep the Pot Boiling." Soon, he had all the money he needed to fund the Christmas dinner. Two years later, McFee's fundraising idea had expanded to 30 kettle locations on the West Coast. He'd grown the program with help from two young Salvation Army officers named William A. McIntyre and N.J. Lewis.

"Wonder no more. Below is a short history of the Salvation Army red kettle, one of the most timeless and successful Christmas fundraising tools of all time. In December of 1891, Captain Joseph McFee of The Salvation Army in San Francisco, California was stumped. He wanted to provide a Christmas dinner for 1,000 poor people, but had no way to pay for it

Then, he had an idea. He thought back to when he was a sailor in Liverpool, England, where on the docks of the city's waterfront he remembered seeing a large pot into which charitable donations could be thrown.

Soon after Christmas 1895, McIntyre and Lewis were transferred to the East Coast. They took with them the idea of a Christmas kettle. McIntyre was stationed in Boston. During the 1897 Christmas season, he, his wife and sister set up three kettles in the heart of the city. 


