Some Catholic Church teachings on Angles:

- 1) Who?
 - a) God made spiritual beings we call angles to share in his glory and to be a part of his life. Throughout salvation history, Angels participate in God's work of love to redeem us. They unceasingly serve and adore God.
- 2) What?
 - a) Angels are spiritual, non-corporeal, immortal beings, with intelligence and will, created by God to act as his messengers and serve him in other ways.
 - b) At their creation, the angels make a permanent choice **for** or **against** God: those who rejected God all the fallen angels also called demons who are led by Satan.
 - c) Angels have no family life: they do not procreate: they are each their own species.
- 3) When?
 - a) Angels have existed since creation and serve throughout the history of salvation from the closure of Eden to the second coming of Christ.
- 4) Why?
 - a) Angels are messengers in service of God and his son Jesus.
 - b) Angels are protectors of God's human creatures.
 - c) Angels all proclaimers of Jesus incarnation and his resurrection.
 - d) Angels are always beholding the face of God and angels adore praise and glorify Him continually for us.
- 5) Are there bad angles?
 - a) Angels who reject God are the fallen angels or demons.
 - b) Since bad angels are eternal beings, they cannot repent of the choice they made at their creation because at the time of their creation they had the perfection of knowledge. They have no reason to repent.
