

Dear Parishioners,

This bulletin was prepared on Monday March 9, since that time, as we all know, many things have changed. As explained in my letter below you will notice that many events that are listed in the bulletin have since been cancelled.

As I am sure you have been, I, too, have been following the progress and the reports about the COVID-19 Virus. Governor Mike DeWine issued an order preventing gatherings of over 100 people to help curtail the spread of the virus. Mass and other religious services, such as funerals and weddings, were excluded from this order and are still permitted. As such, the Diocese has encouraged all parishes to maintain as regular a Mass schedule as possible for those who wish to gather for prayer. However, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been dispensed for the weekends of March 14/15, March 21/22, and March 28/29. It is possible that this may be extended as conditions warrant.

The Mass is broadcast on Sunday at 6:00 a.m. on WJW-FOX (you could DVR). Radio station 1330 AM broadcasts the Mass on Sunday at 9:00 a.m., and 1260 AM at 10:30 a.m. Sunday. Also, the Diocese of Cleveland carries the homily as a YouTube video at <u>dioceseofcleveland.org</u>, (search for TV Mass). EWTN broadcasts the Mass at 8:00 a.m. and Noon.

During this time our parish will maintain a normal liturgical schedule with some modifications. All Masses will take place without the distribution of the Precious Blood (the Whole Christ is received when receiving the host). We will also discontinue the handshake at the exchange of the Sign of Peace. Eucharistic Ministers have long sanitized their hands before the distribution of Communion and will continue this practice. They will now additionally sanitize their hands after distribution of Communion.

There will not be an offertory procession. The collection basket will not be passed, but there will be baskets where you can place your offering.

Although the Diocese of Cleveland has not forbidden receiving Communion on the tongue, many dioceses have. I discourage reception on the tongue and recommend if you really want to receive on the tongue that you receive from me. I say that just because I have distributed Communion for 50 years, distribute communion more frequently than Eucharistic Ministers, and probably only touch someone's mouth once or twice a year.

Bulletins will not be handed out, but will be available as you exit the church.

Confirmation has been postponed by the Diocese of Cleveland until after Easter.

Stations of the Cross will be celebrated on Fridays at 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. The station books will be in church all day, so you may wish to pray the stations privately.

St. Anselm School and PSR will stop Monday, March 16, and students will be given work to do at home.

The Lenten Series on Tuesday afternoons and Wednesday evenings are both cancelled.

As this is a very fluid situation further directives from the Governor and the Diocese may change what I have written above. Other things may be cancelled or changed as it become prudent or necessary. We will keep you informed.

In the meantime, keep praying. Pray for those who are sick and pray for those who are affected because of the virus.

Notes from Father Tom...

David Fuller has told me he plans to retire the week after Easter.

He told me some time ago but asked me not to say anything until this time. David has planned the liturgical music here and has been the primary cantor here for twenty years. David's wife, Susan, has already retired and this will give them flexibility to visit their daughters who both live out of town. They have two grandchildren in North Carolina and we all know what a draw grandchildren are. David has helped our parish a lot and we will miss him but I understand his desire to see his family. There will be a reception the week after Easter so that we can wish him well.

I have talked with Rosemary Heredos and she has agreed to plan liturgical music and be the primary cantor. More about her next week.

Last week I encouraged good hygiene practices. It is best to not panic but we should be prudent too. Again, if you are sick, please stay at home and limit your contact with people. It is your option to receive Communion from the cup and to shake hands. I will shake hands if you extend your hand to me but I will try not to initiate handshakes. As health professionals encourage, I wash my hands a lot and you should too.

I noticed this while I was giving communion in the hand, a lot of people touch my hand. They do this for two reasons. One, some close their hands as soon as the host touches their hand so they touch my fingers. Others cup their hand rather than holding it flat making it difficult to avoid touching their hand. Best practice is to hold your hand flat and not take the host out of your hand until you have moved aside.

On this Sunday, the Confirmation candidates will gather for their retreat in preparation for Confirmation here in Kelly Hall at 2 p.m. Sister Sean Groh S.N.D. will serve as the Retreat Director. You may remember her from her time here as principal of St. Anselm School. We are glad to have her among us once again.

Praesidium Sessions which continues to help children to be protected from adults who have the intent to harm them for the benefit of their own needs are completed for the 2019-2020 year. The short presentations each year are to assist children in reading body language, trusting their gut when feeling unsafe, knowing the difference between good and bad secrets, and having the courage to talk to their parent or a trusted adult.

All concepts learned throughout the years culminate with a two night workshop (gr.7) with me in which young adults (through DVD) speak to them about physical, emotional and behavioral boundaries.

Our students listen carefully and through discussion speak their concerns. We assure them these sessions are to help them protect themselves but to also know there are adults who care deeply and in healthy ways in their relationship with them. IF you have any questions about this program which the Diocese requires, please call me at any time.

Taize Evening: Join us in Church this Wednesday, March18th for a time of prayer, praise and silence. The evening will assist all of us in our on-going conversations with God. Bring a family member or friend with you. All ages can grow from this experience of prayer.

Thank you for your prayers for my Ursuline Community as we gathered for 7 days to set our direction for the next four years as well as discerned our new leadership. It was a prayerful time together that strengthened our bonds with one another as well as kept our ministry of service to others in the forefront. I will share more in the future.

# SAINT JOSEPH, HUSBAND OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY March 19

Joseph, someone once joked, was indeed the perfect husband: the only major character in Jesus' story who never utters a word! But the Gospel recounts and the liturgy celebrates his silent witness of faith-filled deeds: "With a husband's love he cherished Mary, the Virgin Mother of God; with fatherly care he watched over Jesus" (Preface of Saint Joseph, Sacramentary). Catholic devotion, therefore, hails him as patron-protector of the universal Church. Some cultures set a festive "Saint Joseph's Table," welcoming the poor and strangers to feast with family and friends. Tradition keeps today as the anniversary of his death, which we presume was peaceful, with Jesus and Mary present. Thus, Catholics invoke Joseph as Patron of a Happy Death. Descended from David's house, which God finished "building" through Joseph's provision of a home for Mary and Jesus, he was, fittingly, a carpenter by trade; thus, patron of workers. Spring, nature's rebirth, begins between his feast and Annunciation (March 25), appropriately, since Joseph's silent obedience and Mary's "Let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38) usher in humanity's spiritual rebirth.—Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. # **THIRST**

Each time today's Gospel story is read, I can't help but think of the many television commercials I've seen depicting perspiring athletes lifting a beverage to their lips while the scorching sun beats down on them. Our culture has definite ideas about how to quench thirst. Today, those ideas are turned upside down. The Samaritan woman operates, initially, on the TV commercial level. She asks Jesus for the flowing water so that she will not have to keep coming to the well. Jesus then talks about what real thirst is, and how he, and he alone, can quench that thirst. Lent calls us to find those places deep within ourselves where we thirst. In our thirst, as did the Israelites, we cry out to God asking for springs of living water. # Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time. *Abstinence* from meat is on all Fridays during Lent for age 14 onwards.

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Seniors are picked up at their place of residence by Geauga Transit, between 8:00 – 9:00AM and greeted as they exit the bus by the ADS staff. Between 2:00 and 2:30PM, the seniors are picked up to be driven back to their place of residence.

ADS participants are offered a nutritious lunch, cognitive stimulation, physical exercise and socialization as part of the program. This is not a medically based program, meaning medications are not given and seniors must be able to toilet and feed themselves.

There is no fee for the ADS Program. We will gladly accept donations to help enhance and grow the program.


