Notes from Sister Noel, O.S.U. ...

We started our registration for school year 2021-22 in the Spring. Usually that was started in mid-July. I am



seeing a number of the registrations arriving each day. This will give us a better chance in sensing numbers in each class as well as attending to sacrament needs (outside of gr.2 and 8).

During the month of June, I am interviewing the children who participated in our PSR Homeschool Program this past year. Because of the pandemic there were nearly 50 children whose parents acted as catechists for their own child(ren). In the past, there may have been 17 students in this program. What a difference! It just was a different year in many ways as you know.

Meeting the children in small groups (5-7) has been helpful in coming to know each child and their learning for the year. Most long to come back to in-class sessions. The catechists as well desire in-class sessions. Everyone misses the interaction and variety of learning that makes it more meaningful. Time will tell what the direction will be this year at St. Anselm PSR.

This week I had been meeting with gr. 3, 4 and 5 students. They were open in sharing their questions about the content. It has been good to be with them. There is nothing better that watching their joy and curiosity come alive.

Grade 3 content is about the life of Jesus while grade 4 looks at the Old Testament, centering on the Commandments as guides for our lives. Grade 5 focuses on the Mass and sacraments. The children are open to God, especially at this age and younger. Well, at least, let's say it is easier to witness.

The children are encouraged to continue learning their prayers and praying throughout their summer. They are reminded to be of help to others. Service is what Jesus asked of his disciples (and us) at the Last Supper. Prayer and action are good practices in the life of Christians.

May all of us find ways of combining those two practices throughout our summer days.

From the of Sister Denise Marie ...

Every Father's Day since the time I was 13 years old, I have visited my Dad's grave at Holy Cross Cemetery in Brook Park, Ohio. This tradition began in 1976, just a few months after my Dad died on March 10, 1976. My Mom never drove a car, but she always somehow found a way to bring all 7 of her children to the cemetery both on Father's Day and on my Dad's birthday. Even after all these years, spending time at the graves of my parents still brings tears to my eyes, a peace to my heart, and a song of thanksgiving to God for their selfless and sacrificial love for me and my brothers and sisters.

I wish I had my Dad on earth for a longer time. Even now, I sometimes feel a bit shortchanged not having him around for most of my life. But I know our father/daughter relationship remains forever and

that even from heaven, my Dad continues to guide, to pray for, and to watch over his "little girl." My father is a hero to me. He was not only a soldier in World War II, but a soldier for his faith and his family.



This Father's Day, like all Father's Day, I will bring white roses to the grave of my Dad. This is the traditional flower and color for fathers who are deceased. Red roses are to be worn for fathers still living. On Father's Day (and lots of other days) I talk to my Dad heart to heart. I share with him what's happening in my life and always thank him (and my mom) for the many precious gifts and values they have instilled in me and handed down to me. They taught me to treasure my Catholic faith, to never forget the importance of family, friends and forgiveness, to daily acquire an "attitude" of gratitude no matter what each day brings, and above all, to truly love God and one another with all my heart, even when it is not easy.

The following tells the story of how Father's Day began in our country. I found it very interesting, informative and inspiring.

The story of Father's Day...

In the early 1900's, Sonora Smart Dodd of Washington, who was born in Arkansas, wanted a special day to honor her father, William Jackson

Smart. William, a Civil War veteran, was widowed when his wife (Sonora's mother) died in childbirth with their sixth child. Mr. Smart was left to raise the newborn and other five children by himself on a rural farm in eastern



Washington state. It was after Mrs. Dodd became an adult that she realized the strength and selflessness her father had shown in raising his children as a single parent. She worked throughout her life to make Father's Day a national observance.

The first Father's Day was observed on June 19, 1910, in Spokane, Washington. At about the same time in various towns and cities across America other people were informally beginning to celebrate a "father's day." In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day, but it wasn't until 1966 that President Lyndon Johnson



issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers on the 3rd Sunday in June. Then, six years later, in 1972, President Richard Nixon signed Proclamation 4127 making Father's Day a

permanent federal holiday, over 50 years after Mother's Day came into existence.

And the woman who started it all? Sonora Smart Dodd was able to see her dream come true. She died six years later, in 1978, at the age of 96.

This Father's Day, may we first give thanks and praise to our Father in heaven and also honor St. Joseph, the patron saint of fathers and our Universal Church. May we also remember and celebrate dads, stepfathers, grandfathers, godfathers, uncles, parish priests, and all the men, living and deceased, who tirelessly and selflessly gave and give of themselves for us.

Thank you Dads for all you have taught us, for the memories we have shared with you that remain forever in our hearts, and for the



many ways you love us today and every day both from heaven and here on earth!


