

Notes from Sister Noel ...

Our Confirmation families started the year with our official Opening which took place on Oct. 4, the feast of St.



Francis of Assisi. All the sponsors were gathered to take on this important role in the life of one of our Confirmation candidates. Parents and students watched from home the livestreamed session which is now archived.

We began the session with Father Chris introducing himself and welcoming all to this special year of preparation. All prayed the prayer of St. Francis, the Peace Prayer. You know it well, it begins "Make me a channel of your peace...". This prayer was appropriate not only because it was St. Francis' feast day but because the prayer directs us in how to live our Christian vocation.

Sometimes beginners wonder how do we pray or act like Jesus? What book will help me? What person? In what direction do I go? I think this prayer of St. Francis gives us a concise blue print as to what that looks like.

His prayer calls us from our heads to our hearts. The person of peace is a gift wherever he/she goes. To possess the qualities expressed in the prayer is a challenge for most of us. We could use it as an Examination of Conscience, right? I think it will lead you in the direction you are to go.

We hope the families of our Confirmation candidates will be awakened to the ways of God whether it is found in Scripture, a homily, a familiar prayer reflectively said or in the example of others practicing their faith. We as a Church community, whether we know it or not, are models of what it means to be an active Catholic.

We pray for the parents and sponsors who have an opportunity to grow along with their candidate sharing their faith journey and awakening our youth to their own journey. You know how important it is for each of us to "watch where we are going."




