

From the Desk of Father Chris

"Christ beside me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ within me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me." (St. Patrick)

This weekend we hear one of my favorite Gospel readings: The Woman at the Well. It's the story of how an encounter with Jesus Christ can create the most unlikely of heroes. The woman at the well becomes the first evangelist in the Gospel of John as she goes into a town where she has a terrible reputation and invites them to encounter Jesus. This story coincides well with our 3rd week of highlighting one of the Lively Virtues and one of the Deadly Sins. This week's focus is on the virtue of Chastity and the sin of Lust. What can we ponder this week? Jesus helped many people, including the woman at the well. realize their dignity. Human beings have been created in God's image, and it was for love of humanity that Jesus died on the cross. As Christians, we follow Jesus's example of seeing that dignity in each other.

Saint Spotlight of the Week: St. Patrick

Most of us know and celebrate St. Patrick's Day, but other than the color of green and

shamrocks, most of us don't know much about the actual Saint, Saint Patrick became missionary to Ireland from Britain. He saw that the native Irish people needed to know about Jesus Christ. He was met with much resistance, but despite this resistance and threats to his life, he would continue to try to evangelize the Irish people. Through visions,



he would see how much the Irish pagans needed God. And after securing a foothold in Ireland, Christianity began to blossom quite quickly despite continued opposition from the Irish druids. Irish Christians and the fire they had for Jesus Christ would become instrumental for the re-Christianization of Europe. Bishop Malesic has lifted the abstinence from meat on March 17th to honor St. Patrick, but asks that we choose another day to abstain from meat this week.

Notes from Sister Noel

As we began Lent on the Ash Wednesday, we may have sensed we had a chance to begin again in



consciously seeking God. We spent time in choosing the action we would take or stop taking in this holy season of change.

Yes, most of us have begun like this each Lent. Maybe already, we failed in keeping to what we have promised. This experience alone could lead us to either giving up or to being led to a deeper realization of how we need God to help us.

As it is said, "it is not the falling down, but the getting up that is difficult." Are we "getting up" more often than in the past? Are we attempting to continue on our path alone or are we now calling on God to give us strength to keep on keeping on? Does this humble us a bit? That's okay, if we now trust God more.

God is not calling us to perfection but to awareness and reliance on Him to provide what we need when we need it. Are we also becoming more aware of the needs of others? Are we moving in compassion as we journey with others in their moment of weakness? Be aware.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus noticed the Samaritan woman alone and tired. His request for water was an opportunity for her to make a difference in someone's life. Her coming in the hottest part of the day was to avoid judgement and insult of those who would have gathered. In return for the drink, Jesus engaged her in conversation, a conversation which would change her life and even the way she would look at herself. Do our words spoken to another enhance their self-esteem or do our words diminish it? Be aware.

As I told PSR students, "Jesus' library was people." He read people well. He read their hearts. His healing words made all the difference. Are we too busy to learn to read people? Slow down. Be aware.

Do we believe that Jesus knows our hearts better than we do? Let us imagine Jesus encountering us in our low moments of sadness, illness or loneliness with the same kindness he encountered the Samaritan woman. In healing us, we can become His instruments like she did.


Faith Seeks Understanding



As most of you know, our parish Food Ministry used to collect food donations on a monthly basis pre-pandemic. Well life pretty much changed for everything during the pandemic and the food collection was discontinued and the Collinwood Food Pantry was closed for a period of time. Since their re-opening, we have, however, continued to use your monetary donations to purchase and deliver the food items that the pantry desperately needs the most and we thank you for your continued monetary donations. We are happy to inform you that we are going to start up a limited food collection at certain times during the year. The first will be for Lent and we will collect specific items the last 2 weekends of March 2023 (March 18-26). A list of items can be found at the bulletin board next to the food ministry envelopes. Please only bring items that are on the list. The items collected will be divided up between the Collinwood and Chesterland pantries. Boxes will be available in the baptistery to place items in. Thank you for your continued participation in this important ministry.

RCIA News

Today we begin the Scrutinies, a Lenten practice that the Church has incorporated into the liturgies of the third, fourth and fifth Sundays. The Scrutinities are intended to offer further guidance to the Elect and Candidates to examine their lives and their faithfulness in the light of the Gospel. The Church has chosen three stories in which Jesus connected deeply with a



Samaritan woman, a man born without sight and Lazarus, a friend who has died while Jesus was away. These stories are not all that different from our own. So, truly the Scrutinites are guidance for all of us. They present a mirror for us to examine how our lives measure up to the Gospel invitations of Jesus.

In this Sunday's Gospel the Samaritan woman meets Jesus at a well where she comes to fill her pitcher. This woman comes to the well in the heat of the day, presumably because she an outcast in her own village and definitely as a Samaritan and a woman in Israel. Her encounter with Jesus is a beautiful exchange in which Jesus tells her everything she has ever done and then touches her soul with his healing grace of acceptance and truth.

The woman becomes Jesus' first disciple and goes back to her own village inviting others to know him as well. She drinks in the life-giving water and offers this to others whose thirst too can be quenched in a way so to never grow thirsty again.

The fourth Sunday is an invitation to open ourselves to the Light of World, Jesus. The blind man meets Jesus who heals him without being asked. The blind man then engages in a dialogue with the Pharisees in which he witnesses to Jesus as a man whose good works are from God.

The fifth Sunday is the story of Lazarus. Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead which is a precursor of his own resurrection and a promise to us as well.

The challenge for us all is to risk discipleship and share the life-giving miracle that Jesus offers to each of us in our journey toward him.


