From the Desk of Fr. Chris

"The dignity of the human person implies and requires uprightness of moral conscience. I wanted to begin this article with a bit of great news for our parish family. For the past several months we've been advertising a new position on the parish staff: Director of Youth and

Young Adult Ministries. After posting the position on a variety of different websites and locally on social media, our website, and in our bulletin – I began the interview process about a month ago. I'm happy to announce that Mr. Brandan Bizzi has been hired as our parish's first-ever full-time Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries. Brandan grew up in the Parma area at Holy Family parish. After graduating from Holy Family grade school, he would graduate four years later from Holy Name High School. In High School he was involved greatly as a teenager in youth ministry at his parish and Holy Name High School. It would be what would inspire him to eventually get his degree in Theology at Franciscan University of Steubenville. Brandan comes to us with experience both in youth ministry and he is currently running a young adult group at Mary Queen of Peace in Old Brooklyn. I look forward to seeing the good work that Brandan does in ministry here at St. Anselm. When he officially begins, he will introduce himself at weekend Masses. Also on a personal note, let's keep him in our prayers as he prepares for the Sacrament of Matrimony in a few months.

This weekend we celebrate Catechetical Sunday, which is also our annual kick-off for our PSR program. At each Mass we'll bless our catechists, those tasked with teaching the faith, and recognize them for their role here at the parish and across the Diocese. Thank you to all of you for your witness to our Catholic faith in both word and action. Let's say an extra prayer this weekend for Sr. Noel, our DRE, as well as our catechists and PSR students.

Last week we had students plug our annual St. Anselm Gala. This year marks the 60th anniversary of St. Anselm School. The Gala helps to support the efforts at St. Anselm School including providing scholarships, supplies, upgrades, and new equipment. As of this writing, there is a Gaga Ball pit that is pending installation near our playground that was a result of the fundraising efforts of the Gala and other events. Consider joining us for the Fall Gala on November 4th or contributing in some way to make this year's Gala another great success.



RELIGIOUS ORDERS

One beautiful and unique aspect of our Catholic faith has been the formation of what we call religious orders. Put simply, religious orders are communities of men or women that join together to pursue holiness under a common rule and set of charisms. In a general sense, a charism is a gift from God that helps build up the Church. For religious communities, a charism is the soul of the community, that which gives it purpose, motivation and animates its action.

In addition, every religious community has a rule, which helps to define what the community is and how it lives. The rule gives guidelines on every aspect of community life, from their habit, spirituality and ministry to even such things as how meals should be taken. Most religious communities base their rule off of the Rule of Saint Benedict, who is was the first to write a formal rule for his community, and is considered the pioneer in forming religious communities.

As stated earlier, religious orders can consist of either males or females. Some are cloistered orders, meaning that these men or women make the free choice to enter into a community in a single location (called a monastery) and vow to dedicate themselves wholly to prayer for the world. They decide never to leave the walls of their monastery, unless under emergency or extreme circumstances.

The religious that we tend to be familiar with are known either as sisters, or religious brothers and fathers. These men and women have a charism not only of prayer and reparation for sins, but often of a specific ministry, such as teaching, preaching, ministry to the poor, elderly,

Regardless of where or how they minister, these men and women are called specifically for God's purpose. It is a vocation, much like the sacrament of Matrimony, that lasts a lifetime.


