

From the Desk of Fr. Chris

This month of November promises to be another active month for us at St. Anselm. I'm very grateful to our staff and many volunteers who dedicate themselves to the cornucopia of programming, events, and opportunities.

I enjoyed seeing many of you at the Halloween Carnival. It was great seeing so many of our parish families come together. It was also a great blessing to see many of you join us for extra prayer opportunities like the Eucharistic Adoration on October 27th. Prayer is certainly at the heart of what we keeps us connected with heaven.

Speaking of heaven, we want to continue to pray for the repose of the souls of the faithful departed throughout the course of the month of November. Consider spending some time near the tabernacle this month to pray for your deceased loved ones as well as those who don't have anyone to pray for them. You'll notice that "burying the dead" and "praying for the dead" are at the bottom of both the *corporal* and *spiritual works of mercy* banners by the main entrance to our church. Let's dedicate ourselves to this beautiful act of mercy.

This coming Tuesday is Election Day. In our recent bulletins, we've published information from the Ohio Conference of Catholic Bishops in regards to Issue 1. You've also seen our signs out front of the Church. This is a big moral issue as it pertains to not only the dignity of human life, but also to the dignity of the family. Issue 1 is a very deceptive, vague, and poorly written issue that preys on the most vulnerable among us. This was written this way purposefully. The vocabulary is so broad that it can be interpreted in numerous different destructive ways. Pope Paul VI in writing *Humane Vitae* shortly after the Second Vatican Council prophesized that with the destruction of the family comes the destruction of society. As Catholics, we are called to support life in all of its stages. The number one part of our identity is as beloved sons and daughters of God – claimed at our Baptism. We are morally encouraged to vote "No" on Issue 1. May the intercession of St. Michael and all the Angels and Saints be with us this week.

Encounter Church

Indulgences

Indulgences are what we receive when the Church lessens the temporal (lasting only for a short time) penalties to which we may be subject even though our sins have been forgiven. To understand this, we must first understand fully the two consequences of sin: temporal and eternal.

The *eternal consequence* of sin is everlasting death. However, as Saint Paul writes: "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Thanks to Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross, our eternal consequences of sin (everlasting death, meaning Hell) are wiped clean, should we choose to embrace the mercy of Jesus and live according to God's Law.

Temporal consequences of sin are penalties for our sins that remain, even after sin is forgiven. Think of these as paying for something that has been damaged by our carelessness or bad choices. If you damage something belonging to another, they may forgive you, but also expect you to right the wrong caused by your actions. Although Jesus paid the price for our sins before God, he did not relieve our obligation to repair what we have done.

At the end of our lives, even though we have been wiped clean of eternal damnation, God will still ask us to account for our wrongs in Purgatory. But because God is loving and merciful, He gives us the opportunity to lessen that temporal restitution before death, through the ministry of the Church.


Indulgences are gained for an individual through acts of piety, charity, and virtue. They are granted by the Church which draws from the fount of God's great mercy. In the Gospel of John, Jesus gives the Apostles the authority to "bind and loose." The Church has the ability to dispense God's mercy to the faithful whenever the conditions are met for an indulgence for the remission of temporal punishment.

Church teaching on indulgences was pronounced explicitly at the Council of Trent (1545-1563). The belief in indulgences and their effectiveness is not up for individual debate, but is part of infallible doctrine.

Conditions to be met for indulgences are different depending on which indulgence one seeks. If you are interested in gaining an indulgence or learning more, ask a priest or deacon!

Notes from Sister Noel

November in our beliefs as Catholics calls us to remember. We remember on **All Saints' Day** the official canonized followers of Jesus. The saints who have not been formally recognized yet are saints known to God and invited to sit at the Heavenly Banquet. Who are the Holy Ones you remember who you have known in your lifetime?



The Holy Ones are among us as well. They are those who by their example stretch us to be kinder, more courageous, faithful and loving. They are the people living out the Beatitudes. They seem to possess the wisdom to know how to meet the circumstances of each day in a Christ-like manner. Take time to remember them, one by one, in your prayers. You may want to acknowledge the gift of each one's presence in your life. May you receive the grace to be attentive to the spiritual gifts you have been given. Be sure to share them with others.

All Souls' Day invites us to remember those who have died whether recently or long ago. We pray for them and give thanks that they gifted our life in some way. These people live on in our memory still able to influence us in life journey.

In remembering the grace-filled moments and the people, who were part of them, we are led to give thanks to God and to the individuals who have touched your lives. That's sounds like the November attitude, right? (Thanksgiving).

Our peace and joy rest on our relationship to God, who provides what we need and sometimes even what we want. God's generosity needs to be acknowledged as well. May this November find us recognizing more readily what we have rather than what we don't have. It is the familiar question, "Do we see the glass half full or half empty?"





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT ISSUE 1



What is Issue 1?

Issue 1 is a proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that would endanger the health and safety of women, threaten parental rights, and allow for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. Ohioans will vote on November 7, 2023, whether to make this change to the Ohio Constitution.

What would Issue 1 do?

Put women at risk:

- **Health and safety standards in Ohio could be eliminated.** Doctors could no longer need to examine a woman or explain the risks of the abortion procedure ahead of time.

Threaten parental rights:

- **A fifteen-year-old could have an abortion without her parents knowing.** Current Ohio law requires parental notification and consent before a child under 18 can obtain an abortion. These parental right protections could be removed as they directly conflict with the amendment which would allow all individuals, including minors, to make their own reproductive decisions.

Allow for abortions of fully formed babies:

- **Abortion would be legal through all 9 months of pregnancy.** Physicians at an abortion clinic could use a woman's age or emotional well-being as a reason to perform an abortion in the 3rd trimester.

Would abortion be illegal in Ohio if Issue 1 does not pass?

If Issue 1 does not pass, abortion would still be legal in Ohio until a baby's heartbeat can be detected. This standard was challenged in court and placed on hold, allowing for abortions up to 22 weeks as of September 15, 2023. Current laws that protect the safety of women and parental rights would stay in effect.

Doesn't Issue 1 simply restore Ohio back to when Roe v. Wade was in effect?

Issue 1 goes dangerously beyond what was legalized in the Roe v. Wade ruling. It opens the door to remove important health and safety measures that protect women, threatens parental consent and notification of any minor seeking an abortion, and allows for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.

Will miscarriage care or ectopic pregnancy treatment be denied if Issue 1 fails?

The passing or failure of Issue 1 will have no effect on the care a pregnant woman receives when her life is in danger, even if the treatment results in the loss of life of her unborn child. There is a fundamental difference between an elective abortion and the care provided after a miscarriage or for ectopic pregnancies. Women can always receive life-saving treatment, including in Catholic hospitals. No law restricts this care in Ohio or any other state in the country.

How is the Church helping pregnant women in need?

For decades, numerous Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with faith-based and secular organizations, have assisted pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment during pregnancy and after their child is born. Project Rachel helps those struggling post-abortion. Every woman should be able to depend upon a community for support and the Catholic Church remains committed to woman in need.

Each diocese in Ohio is working together, through the Catholic Conference of Ohio, to help Catholics understand the dangers of Issue 1 to women, parents, and life. We are also part of the Protect Women Ohio coalition to let all voters know Issue 1 is harmful for Ohioans.
