

Happy New Year! This weekend we begin Advent Week 1. Whilst it is a short liturgical season, Advent is a great time of preparation for all of us. Like Lent, Advent is a penitential season of anticipation. We anticipate the celebration of Christmas at the end of Advent and our waiting is marked by the lighting of a new Advent candle each week on our Advent wreath. Like preparing for a trip or an event, we also prepare ourselves for celebration of Christmas. This seems to be increasingly more difficult year after year as commercialism truly takes over this time. It is difficult to avoid advertisements and consumerism while also trying to prepare our homes for Christmas. As many of you heard me say this past weekend, the Church has become one of the few havens away from culture's attitude for this time of year. At Church, we get a chance to slow down, reflect, and communicate with God. Perhaps consider taking one of the Advent prayer book companions for you and your family this weekend. Let's make this Advent a time that we reflect on the true meaning of the Christmas story.

One of the upcoming opportunities for prayer will be happening this Friday, December 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm. We'll have an Advent XLT – Eucharistic Adoration with communal music as our community's prayer. We last did an XLT in Lent, which attracted people of all ages. Consider joining me and many others. This Thursday we celebrate the vigil of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception at 7pm and we have Mass the next morning at 8:30AM (Friday). Immaculate Conception is a Holy Day of Obligation and a beautiful opportunity to enter more fully into the season of Advent. I look forward to praying with many of you at these extra prayer opportunities.

This year we're blessed to have had the help of many people to help us get ready for Advent. A special thank you to our parish staff and art & environment committee for brightening up our parish campus with beautiful decorations. This year we have additional trees not just in the Church, but also in the parish center. There are extra lights on the outside of the Church. And new for this year, a very generous parish family donated a new Church Nativity set! Thank you to so many of you! Also a special thank you to many of you who helped to augment our space by donating a nativity set for display in the Church Baptistry and hallway.

# The Advent Wreath

As Christmas draws nearer and Advent begins, a familiar household object that we see around this time is the Advent Wreath.

The Advent Wreath is more than simply a decoration; it is highly symbolic and purposeful. The actual origins of the Advent Wreath are unknown, but there is evidence of pre-Christian Germanic people using wreaths with lighted candles in the winter months as a sign of hope in the future of warmth and longer days.

By the Middle Ages, the Christians adapted this tradition and used Advent wreathes as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas. After all, Christ is "the Light that came into the world" to dispel the darkness of sin and to radiate the truth and love of God (cf. John 3:19-21). By 1600, both Catholics and Lutherans had more formal practices surrounding the Advent wreath.

The symbolism of the Advent wreath is beautiful. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. The candles represent the four weeks of Advent. A tradition is that each week represents one thousand years, to sum to the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Savior. Three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas. The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead.

The light again signifies Christ, the Light of the world. Some modern day adaptions include a white candle placed in the middle of the wreath, which represents Christ and is lit on Christmas Eve. Another tradition is to replace the three purple and one rose candles with four white candles, which will be lit throughout Christmas season.

### Notes from Sister Noel

We are having an Advent Event for ages 4-7 who have been a part of our Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) each week. Our CLOW Program was redesigned after COVID open to age 4 to 9 year olds. It was my hope it would grow and in time split into a younger and older group.



It has grown. We range from 10-20 on a weekend. Mrs. Seel, a parishioner moving back to Geauga County, offered to start a Sunday School Program. We are experimenting on creating one for next year by checking out the interest level of children/parents.

Our Advent Event will focus on Advent Wreath (Dec.3), Annunciation (Dec. 10) and Nativity of Jesus (Dec. 17). The children will meet in our present Kindergarten Room which is right next to the south door of the school. Parents will be able to go to church for the 9:00 Mass. After Mass, they will return to pick up their child(ren) either to head home or to Coffee and Donuts.

Mrs. Smith, K teacher in St Anselm School, will be present along with one of our Catechists as well as our junior helper. We are excited to present the lessons for them. The older children or those who have not already registered will be with me on Dec. 3 at CLOW. CLOW will take place also the following 2 weeks of Advent at 9:00 Mass as usual.

Pictures will be taken. We will share later. A full hour session will be an adjustment for children but we hope that what we have planned will carry them through the hour.

On Dec. 3<sup>rd</sup> the Confimation Candidates and their Sponsors will gather for 11:00 Mass, Lunch and their 3<sup>rd</sup> Session in our Confirmation Preparation Program. The top is Jesus Christ. We look forward to our time together.




