Abuse and Neglect Prohibition

Abuse and neglect are something that no one ever wants to talk about. St. Dominic Village takes care of some of the most vulnerable in our population, abuse and neglect are issues that we take seriously and will investigate.

No matter where you live on campus, St. Dominic Village has a zero tolerance policy for abuse. Each resident has the right to be free from mistreatment, neglect, abuse, involuntary seclusion, injuries of unknown origin and misappropriation of property. At St. Dominic Village we have a strict policy that any observation or allegation of abuse, neglect, mistreatment must immediately be reported to the Abuse Prevention Coordinator.

Amy Shields, CEO, is the Abuse Prevention Coordinator at St. Dominic Village. If anyone observes abuse on our campus, you are obligated to report it immediately. The facility will then begin an investigation to ensure that all residents here on campus are safe.

Care Ambassadors Program

St. Dominic Village is introducing an exciting new program, called the “Care Ambassadors” in the Rehabilitation and Nursing Center. Care Ambassadors are a group of 28 employees (pictured below are 17 of our 28 ambassadors) that will be consistently checking on residents that live in the RNC on a weekly basis. They will not only be checking in on the residents, but they will also be contacting their responsible parties twice a month providing updates.

This is a great way for the staff to get to know the residents and the families, and for the families and residents to have another “go to” person with any concerns they may have.

The Care Ambassadors are assigned various resident rooms and provide additional attention to their residents.

Since this is a new program, there may be adjustments over the upcoming months as we strive to make it as beneficial as possible for our residents and their families.

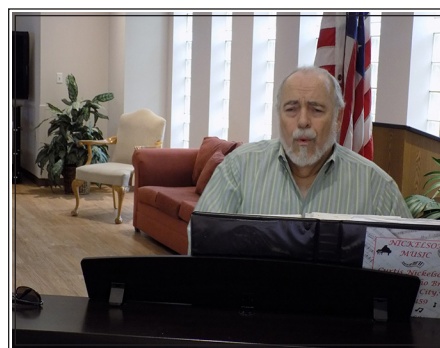


Paint the Village Green!

Physician Spotlight

Dr. Robert Tan has been a part of the St. Dominic Village family since 2002 as the Medical Director. He was recently Chief of Geriatrics at Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center and Associate Professor of Internal Medicine (Geriatrics), Baylor College of Medicine. He is a full time Professor at the University of Texas-Houston and the Director and Founder of OPAL Medical Clinic. He has been instrumental in the training of many Houston area Geriatricians and Family Physicians, even our own Dr. Julia Reyser!

Our Medical Director is quite accomplished to say the least. He received his medical degree from the National University of Singapore and completed Family Medicine and Internal Medicine training in Singapore and England. He completed Fellowships in Geriatric Medicine at both Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio and at the Royal Postgraduate Medical School in London, UK. He also is a Certified Medical Director as well as Certified Physician Executive of the American College of Physician Executives. He is board certified in Geriatric Medicine and Family Medicine. He has been voted by peers as one of the *Best Doctors in America* consecutively since 2001. Dr. Tan has published more than 100 peer reviewed scientific journals and abstracts. He is an international thought leader on impact of androgens in dementia. He has written two books and is the editor of the textbook entitled *Aging Men's Health*.

Dr. Tan faithfully plays in the annual Bishop Rizzotto Golf Classic every year; the biggest fundraiser of the year for St. Dominic Village. He is loved by the residents and staff at St. Dominic Village. He provides essential training and oversight for our nursing staff in addition to serving as the attending physician to many of our resident across campus.

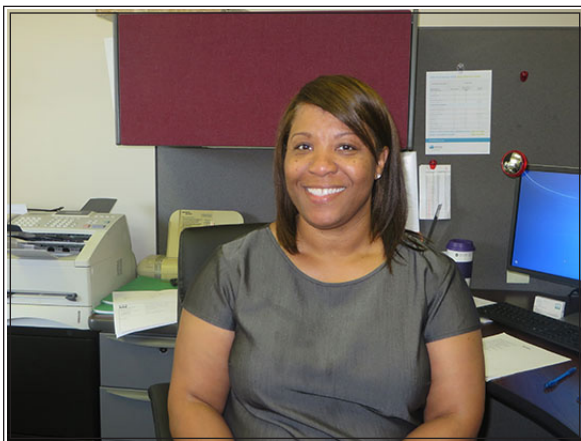
