# CHARLOTTE HALL **AQUARIUM**

This resident favorite in Charlotte Hall is on its way to being fully renovated, after suffering carpenter ant damage in January of this year.

Our 300 gallon fish aquarium is host to five to six different kinds of fresh-water fish at a time, which get rotated out every couple of months. Before the renovations, the original structure had been in place since Charlotte Hall was built in September 2002.

Thanks to the generosity of our Patron Corps and other donors, we were able to commission Better Birds and Fish of Texas to restore our aquarium to its original glory.

Renovation is set to be completed in the upcoming weeks so that our residents, visitors, and volunteers can once again enjoy the exotic

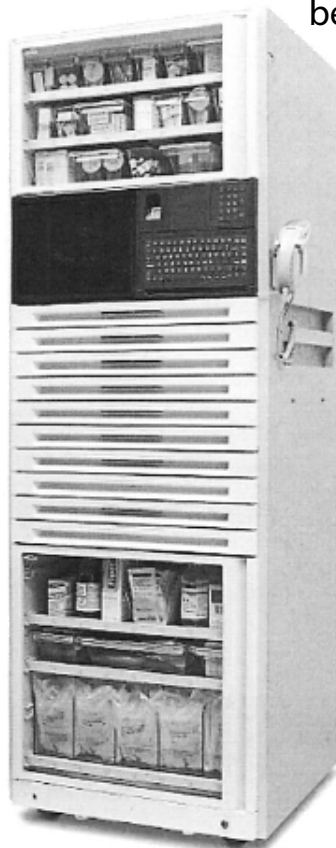
We are now able to better manage and maintain supplies at the point of use helping to reduce costs, reduce consumption, and ultimately ensure

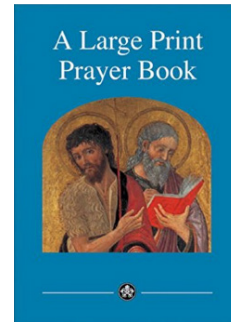

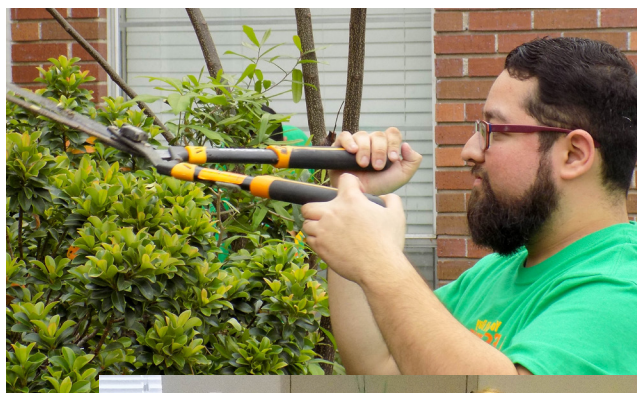
# VOLUNTEER CORNER
