



Save The Date: November 28, 2021 - 2pm In the Main Church

Treasures of the Church is a ministry of evangelization of the Catholic Church. Run by Fr. Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross, its purpose is to give people an experience of the living God through an encounter with the relics of his saints in the form of an exposition. Each exposition begins with a multi-media presentation on the Church's use of relics that is scriptural, catechetical, and devotional, leading to a renewal of the Catholic faith for many people. After the teaching those in attendance have an opportunity to venerate the relics of some of their favorite saints. An exposition involves some 150 relics, including those of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. The supreme highlight is one of the largest relics of the Church's claim to the True Cross in the world and a piece of the Veil that, according to sanctioned tradition, is believed to have belonged to Our Lady.

The veneration of relies is a communion with the heroes of our Christian faith, asking for their powerful intercession. Many people have reported outstanding blessings and conversions through this ministry, and many have reported healings. Attendees are encouraged to bring their articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which may be touched to the reliquaries as a means of intercessory prayer.

The ministry travels throughout the world by invitation. To date, it has been hosted in almost 200 Catholic dioceses in various countries.

Well, the weather is cold here since we are in winter, and it rains a lot, and there is a lot of wind.


Well, my mother-in-law says goodbye to you and your family, hoping you are healthy; may God always protects you from that pandemic.

COMING HOME TO CHURCH 1 The Obligation to Attend Mass

Do you remember when our churches were essentially closed at the start of the pandemic? No more than ten people were allowed to enter for Mass and then the doors were locked.

On just such a day, as I was heading to church for the broadcast of the TV Mass, I met a familiar parishioner outside the doors. "I'm sorry," I apologized to him, "I'm not allowed to let you in." He smiled and said, "No problem, Father," I just stand out here at 10am every Sunday, knowing that Mass is going on inside. It gives me great comfort to know I'm so close to Jesus coming to help his Church in these dark days."



This man's great faith is reflected in the hearts of all those who long to safely return to church, now that the pandemic has lessened, at least for a time. We hunger to be together, remembering that Jesus said "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them."


We hunger to be fed with his Word proclaimed to us, especially in the Gospel. We hunger to eat his Body and drink his Blood in Holy Communion. We hunger to be the people he has gathered to himself, nourished by the Body and Blood of his Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, becoming one body, one spirit in Christ."1

This hunger grows out of a response to the Lord's own command at the Last Supper to "Do this in memory of me" and is a fulfillment of the commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. That's why the law of the Church requires us to participate in Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. For the Mass is the source and summit of our lives and without it we simply cannot live.

From the day you received your First Holy Communion, the Lord has been feeding your soul from the inside out. Gathered with all your brothers and sisters before the Altar and Cross, you have been nourishing you with his Word and Sacrament. The Lord waits to join you to himself in the great Sacrifice of Praise which is our salvation in fulfillment of the joyful obligation to celebrate this holy and living Sacrifice.

Pope Gregory III consecrated a chapel at St. Peter's Basilica to all the saints, as well, with an anniversary date of Nov. 1. Rome adopted Nov. 1 as the date of the feast of All Saints in the eighth century, and in the ninth century Pope Gregory IV extended that observance to the whole of the Latin Church.

Now, centuries later, All Saints' Day is a holy day of obligation and recognized as one of the most important feasts on the liturgical calendar. However, the celebration of Halloween typically overshadows the commemoration of All Saints' Day.

Most of us realize that Halloween is in reality the vigil of All Saints' ("Allhallows Eve" or "Hallow E'en"), but All Saints' Day itself has become a bit of an afterthought.

It shouldn't be this way! The saints are our friends, our intercessors, our brothers and sisters in Christ. They care deeply for us, and their lives are recognized by the Church as exemplary, as models to follow.

So how can we celebrate this wonderful feast of All Saints' Day?


Whether you are commemorating individually or in a group or a family, there are many ways to observe this solemnity. The most obvious is: Go to Mass! It is a holy day of obligation, and there is no more appropriate way to commemorate the saintly lives of those who have gone before us than the eucharistic sacrifice.

It is also good to do other liturgical or prayerful things to mark the day: Pray the Divine Office for All Saints' Day; read the lives of the saints; watch a movie about a saint; pray the litany of saints; think back to your confirmation saint and study that saint's life.

Similarly, if any of your children share the name of a saint, learn about that saint together: Read about the saint and pray together, asking for the saint's intercession.

There are also a number of creative and fun games that can be played to help celebrate All Saints' Day. Try putting on a play of the life of a saint (many Halloween costumes can be repurposed to be saints costumes). There are books for all ages, coloring books and even comic books featuring the saints.

All Saints' Day is the perfect time to pray to all these holy men and women, asking for their intercession for the conversion of sinners, so that we might all become saints.

Nov. 2 is All Souls Day, the special day in the liturgical year set aside to pray for the dead.

But why pray for the dead? There is no need to pray for those who have died and gone straight to heaven.

This feast presumes that some who die are imperfectly purified of their sinfulness, and while assured of the eventual benefits of eternal life, are barred from immediate access to heaven.

Instead, they are held in an unknown place where they are cleansed of their sinfulness, and after an indeterminate time, are finally released to take their place at God's throne.

For centuries, Catholics have said that purgatory is the intermediate place of temporary punishment and purification, and that the length of time spent there is based upon the number and seriousness of one's sins. The church defined this doctrine at the Second Council of Lyons (1274), the Council of Florence (1439) and the Council of Trent (1545-1563).

PURGATORY IN CATECHISM

The term, purgatory, still exists in church literature today (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 1030-1032) despite the fact that it is not mentioned in the Bible. Two New Testament verses allude to a cleansing fire (1 Corinthians 3:15 and 1 Peter 1:7), and they have served as the basis for the concept of purgatory, which evolved from the fifth to 13th centuries.

Today, the church is more inclined to speak about "The Final Purification" (Documents of Vatican II, The Dogmatic Constitution of the Church, Lumen Gen-tium, No. 51).

A key biblical basis for praying for the dead is found in the Old Testament (2 Maccabees 12:38-46). On this All Souls Day or any time throughout the month of November, please consider reserving some time to pray for the dead.
