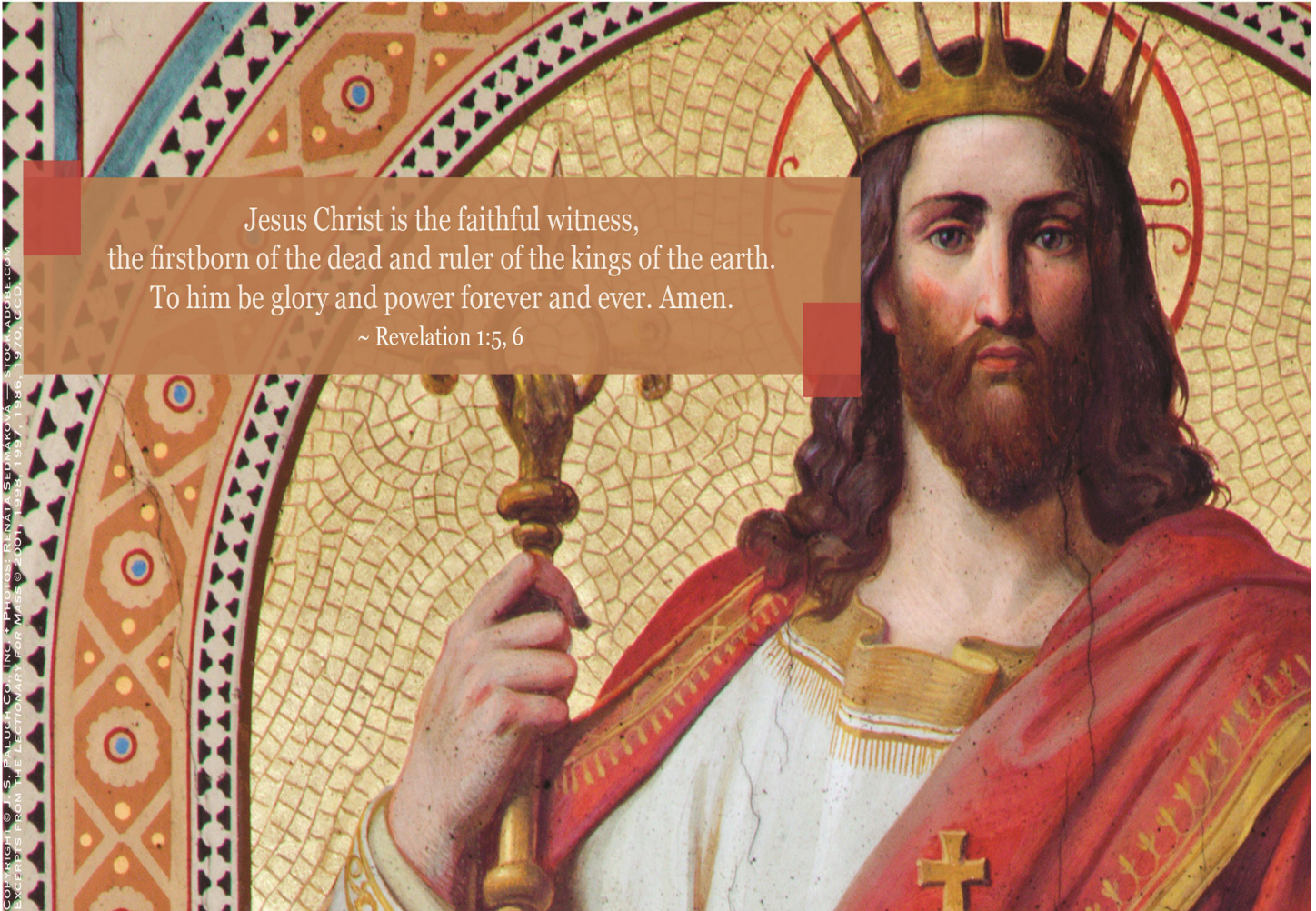

Jesus, open my eyes to Your Presence in the life of every child.

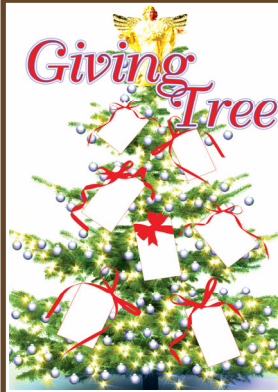
Open my heart to the joy in the birth of every child,

It is that special time of year when the spirit of giving to those less fortunate in our community touches all of us at Sacred Heart. The giving tree will be up for the November 20, 21 weekend masses. This Year you have an opportunity to bring Christmas cheer to a child in one of two ways.

You can purchase a gift for a local child in need by selecting a tag from the tree. Simply take a tag (representing a specific child) and attach it to your gift returning it as soon as possible but no later than the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday, December 11. This year, please do not wrap your gift. You may put your gift in a gift bag without wrapping or simply leave it in the store bag.

You can obtain a virtual tag for a child serviced by Urban Missions in Worcester by going to www.urbanmissionaries.com and scroll down to the virtual tag sign up form. You will receive your tag via email. If you purchase a gift on line, you can have the gift shipped directly to Urban Missionaries of Our Lady of Hope, 242 Canterbury St., Worcester, MA 01603. All that is needed is that you put the tag ID number in the comment section of your order so they will know who the gift belongs to. If you purchase the gift at home, you can print the email gift tag or simply print the tag ID, attach it to the gift and return it to our giving tree as soon as possible but not later than 11:00 A.M. Mass on Sunday, December 11.

The participation by our parish members in the past has always been exceptional. This community outreach program is organized and sponsored by the volunteers of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and we thank you once again for your generosity.

Save The Date: November 28, 2021 - 2pm
In the Main Church

Treasures of the Church is a ministry of evangelization of the Catholic Church. Run by Fr. Carlos Martins of the **Companions of the Cross**, its purpose is to give people an experience of the living God through an encounter with the relics of his saints in the form of an exposition. Each exposition begins with a multi-media presentation on the Church's use of relics that is scriptural, catechetical, and devotional, leading to a renewal of the Catholic faith for many people. After the teaching those in attendance have an opportunity to venerate the relics of some of their favorite saints. An exposition involves some 150 relics, including those of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. The supreme highlight is one of the largest relics of the Church's claim to the True Cross in the world and a piece of the Veil that, according to sanctioned tradition, is believed to have belonged to Our Lady.

The veneration of relics is a communion with the heroes of our Christian faith, asking for their powerful intercession. Many people have reported outstanding blessings and conversions through this ministry, and many have reported healings. Attendees are encouraged to bring their articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which may be touched to the reliquaries as a means of intercessory prayer.

The ministry travels throughout the world by invitation. To date, it has been hosted in almost 200 Catholic dioceses in various countries.

The video will run just over an hour, following we will have light refreshments, as we welcome conversation or any questions you may have.

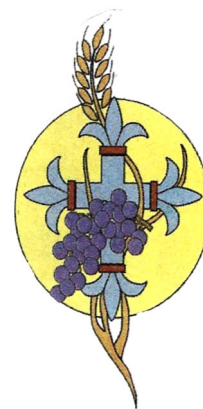

In a well-known Communion hymn, we sing: “You satisfy the hungry heart with gift of finest wheat; come give to us O saving Lord, the bread of life to eat.”

This hymn was composed for the 1976 Eucharistic Congress held in Philadelphia. This Congress focused on the hungers of the human family.

Our hearts are indeed hungry. We hunger for security, relationship, understanding, acknowledgment, and also truth, justice and peace. Our weekly celebrations of the Eucharist will not completely satisfy us, but they do give us nourishment so that we might continue on the journey.

At the table of the word, we find wisdom, truth, and challenge in the Scriptures. We also find an identity as the sons and daughters of Abraham and as disciples of Christ. We belong to an unbroken tradition that spans over 3000 years.

At the table of the Eucharist, we are fed with the very Body and Blood of Christ. Communion with the Lord also brings us into Communion with our brothers and sisters who share the one bread, the one cup. In this community, we find companionship and support.

Celebrating Mass with our parish family also brings us into relationship with all the other communities celebrating Eucharist throughout the world. We are indeed “catholic.”

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Since 1969, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has addressed poverty by attacking its root causes and funding community projects that promote independence as a means of finding a permanent end to poverty. Did you know that 38.1 million Americans live below the poverty line and more than 1.5 million children experience homelessness in a year? Many of these Americans are considered "working poor"—they work but do not make enough money to cover essentials like housing, health care, child care, and food. That's why the CCHD theme is "Help Those on the Margins."

This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs. This year, *seventy-five percent of the collection will stay here in our diocese*. Today I am meeting with our parish and community groups which received 19 local grants from the 2020 campaign, it is always inspiring to see how these small seeds grow into fruitful programs to support the dignity of people who find themselves most often on the margins. During this pandemic, the need has increased dramatically in the many food pantries and emergency assistance programs which receive support from our local CCHD funds.

Please help the efforts of CCHD to break the cycle of poverty. We are "working on the margins" in Central Massachusetts and across America. **Support CCHD Collection on November 20 & 21 as a response to the Fifth World Day of the Poor on November 14** as called for by our Holy Father, Pope Francis. A KING LIKE NO OTHER

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. It is likely that when we think of a king, the image that comes to mind is of pomp, ceremony, and civic authority. Jesus is a king like no other. He is not bound by the constraints of time or place. His authority is everlasting. He is the one “who is and who was and who is to come.” Jesus does not rule as earthly kings govern. Jesus reigns in humble obedience to the will of God the Father and calls us to do the same. It is by following the truth of Christ’s command and listening to his voice of love that we are made into a kingdom, serving the One whose dominion is everlasting.

BAPTIZED INTO CHRIST

In the waters of Baptism, we were drawn into Christ, who is priest, prophet, and king and called to be “alter Christus,” “other Christs.” Christ who is priest sanctifies the everyday stuff of life, building a bridge between God and humanity. Christ who is prophet proclaims God’s love and mercy in a world that desperately needs it. Christ who is king rules the universe in loving, sacrificial service. We who are baptized into Christ are called to bring God’s love into our hearts, homes, places of work, and the wider world. We are called to show and share God’s love to others, especially those who most need the care, compassion, and forgiveness that is at the heart of Christ’s eternal message. We are called to give of ourselves beyond what might seem reasonable, in imitation of our Lord and king who gave himself on the cross and who reigns forever.

CALLED TO LISTEN AND SERVE

Jesus said to Pilate, “Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.” Jesus spoke to the disciples and his voice reaches through the ages in the words of sacred scripture and the tradition of the Church. In prayer, participation in the liturgy, and learning from the saints and the teachings of the Church, we grow in belonging to the truth of Christ’s love. We hear and follow Jesus’ command to wash others’ feet, to love as he loves, to serve as he serves. And while it is certainly our duty to do so, there is more to our service than merely fulfilling the instructions of another. We fulfill Christ’s command as a grateful response to the incredible love of God for us. How will you listen to and serve the Lord? How will you make Jesus the king of your heart and life?

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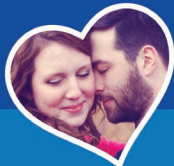
