Blessing of the Throat



Freedom from Fear

This time, a pause in the exploration of the Holy Father's encyclical on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and a glance at what Catholic Social Doctrine has to offer as the past week comes to a close. It's something we can all agree upon as Catholics:

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching.

(First sentence, Theme I, Catholic Social Doctrine.)

This foundational statement is the basis for the Church's unwavering efforts to protect the unborn, and it applies equally to the born.

Here's something else we can all agree upon:

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

(Luke 10:27)

To the Pharisees' question as to exactly who is the neighbor, you may recall that Jesus told the parable of the Good Samaritan, in which the Samaritan — a member of a class of people who were not simply reviled, but who were thought not to have the right to exist at all — the Samaritan turns out to be the one who truly follows this Greatest Commandment.

As Catholics engaged in civil society, we are entitled to our well-informed opinions and choices about candidates, political parties, and policies. But each week we stand together and profess our firm and united belief in God, in Jesus Christ, His only Son, and in the Holy Spirit, a Trinity bound together by love.

The commandment to love our neighbor is not theoretical. Nor is the Church's social doctrine a mere suggestion. We are to advocate for and respect the dignity of every human person; we are to see each other as neighbors and to extend God's love to each one.

It is good and right to arrest and punish criminals for their crimes. But the person who stands before us, who works hard to raise a good family, who shares a pew with us on Sunday morning, who harvests the crops that feed us, builds the homes that house us, manages the bank or the store that helps us meet our everyday needs, or nurses us back to health: that person is our neighbor; that person's life is of inestimable value in the eyes of God, according to the teachings of our faith.

I must have been about eight years old when, as I recall, my mother taught me the "four essential human freedoms:" Freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom from want, and freedom from fear. (Franklin D. Roosevelt, January, 1941)


We pray for the immigrant families in our own community and throughout the nation who work hard, contribute to society, and strive to raise good families, that they may live and work in safety and free of fear.



Luke's Gospel is the only one to mention the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. What is Luke trying to communicate here and what connection does it have with Mary?

February 2 is exactly forty days after December 25, the nativity of Jesus.
Jewish law (Ex 13:2, 12) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God. This was done by the parents as they



presented their Son in the Temple.

Jewish law further specified (Lv 12:2-8) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification.

The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary. These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus. Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored.


