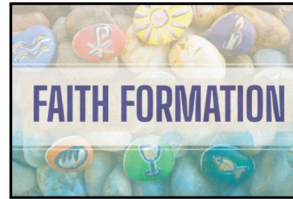

What is the Liturgy of the Word with Children?

The celebration of the Mass is at the heart of the Catholic faith. Here at St. Peter, we follow the practice of a separate Liturgy of the Word with children as suggested in the Directory for Masses with Children. The primary purpose of dismissing children is to provide them with a focused environment where they are more likely to become conscious, active listeners and responders to God's Word. The celebration of the Liturgy of the Word with children is a liturgical experience that opens young people to hear and respond to God's Word in ways that enable them to be nurtured and challenged by its power, and to experience the grace of ongoing conversion to the vision and values of the Word of God.

First, a fix

First, a correction of a pretty good-sized train wreck in last week's essay. It's the paragraph near the end. It starts with "On the other hand, Leo names as "reductive" a reading of scripture that neglects its divine origins and ends up understanding it as a mere human teaching." Here's the correction of what follows:

Rather, especially when proclaimed in the context of the liturgy, Scripture is intended to speak to today's believers, to touch their present lives with their problems, to enlighten the steps to be taken and the decisions to be made. This becomes possible only when believers read and interpret the sacred texts under the guidance of the same Spirit who inspired them.

Then, from St. Augustine...(from here, the published text seems to be ok)

From the Table Both of God's Word and of Christ's Body

The Church is the rightful home of Sacred Scripture says Pope Leo, in his opening sentence of the February 11 General Audience. The Church, he says, is where the Word of God lives, reveals its meaning, and manifests its power. The Word and the Eucharist, along with sacred tradition, together comprise the supreme ruler of faith.

The primary setting for scriptural interpretation, he says, is the life of the Church.

I'll just let him continue for a bit:

*In the ecclesial community, Scripture therefore finds the sphere in which to carry out its particular task and achieve its purpose: to make Christ known and to open dialogue with God. Indeed, "ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ". This well-known expression of Saint Jerome reminds us of the ultimate purpose of reading and meditating on the Scriptures: to get to know Christ and, through Him, to enter into a relationship with God, a relationship that can be understood as a conversation, a dialogue. And the Constitution **Dei Verbum** presented the Revelation to us precisely as a dialogue, in which God speaks to humans as though to friends. This occurs when we read the Bible with an inner attitude of prayer: God then comes towards us and enters into conversation with us.*

The Sacred Scripture, entrusted to the Church and preserved and explained by her, performs an active role: indeed, with its efficacy and power it sustains and invigorates the Christian community. All the faithful are called to drink from this wellspring, first and foremost in the celebration of the Eucharist and the other Sacraments. Love for the Sacred Scriptures and familiarity with them must guide those who carry out the ministry of the Word: bishops, priests, deacons, catechists. The work of exegetes and those who practice biblical sciences is invaluable, and Scriptures have a central place in theology, which finds its foundation and soul in the Word of God.*

Dear friends, living in the Church one learns that the Sacred Scripture is totally relative to Jesus Christ, and one experiences that this is the deep reason for its value and its power. Christ is the living Word of the Father, the Word of God made man. All the Scriptures proclaim his Person and his saving presence, for each one of us and for all humanity. Let us therefore open our hearts and minds in order to receive this gift, following the example of Mary, Mother of the Church.

In this teaching, as in several of the others, we see Pope Leo conveying the idea that the Sacred Scriptures are a conversation between God and us; that God approaches us as a friend who desires a relationship; that a relationship with God is similar to any human relationship in that an open and loving dialogue is essential. For those who learned that God is distant, judging, readily angered, and in need of appeasement, this can be hard to take in. But what more could God do than send His only Son to literally engage with us in dialogue...?

*an exegete is one who performs exegesis, which is to explore the intended meaning of scriptural passages, taking into account history, language, culture, and literary form. In our Catholic tradition, exegesis properly occurs within the Magisterium (teaching authority) of the Church.

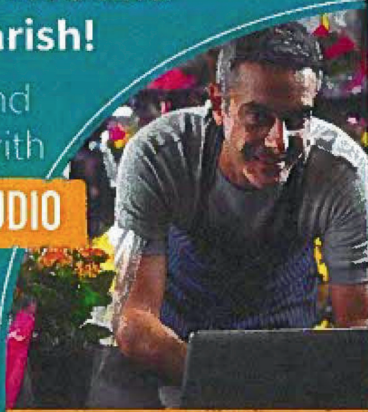
