Sunday Stewardship Reflection Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

St. Paul offers a formula for living the way we are supposed to live as Christians in the Second Reading. Paul writes, "Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves." Doing that is a challenge for most all of us. Yet, that is one of the secrets to being a good steward and living as Christ wants us to live.

To truly live that way requires a dramatic conversion. All of us know people who are so self-centered that they often are not even aware that they are totally unwilling to compromise or to even recognize the value of those around them. Achieving this kind of self awareness, of what kind of a person we are, is a significant step on our faith and life journeys.

Screenwriter and playwright William Nicholson once wrote, "God does not necessarily want us to be happy. He wants us to be lovable, worthy of love, able to be loved by Him. What makes people hard to love? It is called selfishness. Selfish people are hard to love, because so little love comes out of them."

That is our challenge, to love others in such a way that we become lovable as well. Christ told us over and over that the secret to being His disciple and the secret to being a good steward is to "Love your neighbor." That is how to be the kind of person Paul calls us to be as well.

Who Am I?

All too often we pass by the face of yet another stranger, not knowing where they are going, or where they are from. Many of us have boxes and closets full of photos such as these. But do you know who this young woman is?

She would enter the convent when she was only sixteen, and she died when she was only 24 years old. She never went on missions, never founded a religious order, never performed great works, but within 28 years of her death, the public demand was so great that she was canonized.

Interested in learning more about St. Therese of Lisieux (one of my favorite Saints)? I would encourage everyone to read "The Story of a Soul", the autobiography of this young woman who died obscurely, but who has inspired countless men, women and children to personal holiness by what has become known as her "Little Way".

"Each prayer is more beautiful than the others. I cannot recite them all and not knowing which to choose, I do like children who do not know how to read, I say very simply to God what I wish to say, without composing beautiful sentences, and He always understands me. For me, prayer is an aspiration of the heart, it is a simple glance directed to heaven, it is something great, supernatural, which expands my soul and unites me to Jesus." ~St. Therese

Ask the Apologist

Dear Apologist, how do you respond to someone who says belief in God is the result of wish fulfillment?

In the movie Inception, the character Cobb accidentally gives his wife an obsession about the world actually being a dream. This doubt eventually drives her mad. Our culture can do something similar to our belief in God. Rather than presenting real arguments for Atheism, it simply introduces a doubt into the mind of the Christian; "God is a comforting fairy tale we tell ourselves."

The problem with this doubt is it can cut both ways. Sure, the Christian faith can be comforting, fulfilling, and make us happy. But you know what? So can Atheism! Go online and look up an article called, "Five Reasons Why I'm Happier After Leaving My Religion." In it you'll find a man explaining how Atheism has allowed him to lead a more robust sex life without the fear of Hell - and has helped him more fully appreciate life. The internet is filled with other such testimonies of people claiming the comforts of Atheism far outweigh those of religion. Thus, the doubt can be turned around. Is their Atheism a result of wish fulfillment? Did they trick themselves into believing there is no God so they could more easily live as they please? Ultimately, it is useless to wonder whose beliefs are a product of wish-projection. Instead the conversation needs to be moved to whether there are good reasons for believing in God. And there are plenty.

As the saying goes: "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure". Expose your children and godchildren to the many arguments for the existence of God before our culture can sew doubt in their minds. Do not delay!


