

## The Sixth Apparition

In May we began celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Marian apparitions in Fatima, which began in May 1917 and continued until October 1917. This month we remember the sixth and final apparition, which took place on October 13, 1917.

"In her final appearance at Fatima, Mary identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary. The Blessed Mother predicted that the war would soon end, but she also warned that people must repent of their sins and make amends or worse tribulations would follow. She directed that a chapel be built on the site in her honor.

"Our Lady then performed the Miracle of the Sun, which many of the 70,000 people present witnessed. The sun seemed to fade and glow, so that people could look at it directly without suffering pain or harmful effects. People saw it rotate and appear to rise and fall in the sky, alarming many. The sun also seemed to emit beams of different colors.

"Mary then appeared to the children in the company of the Child Jesus and Saint Joseph. The miracle concluded when Mother Mary appeared as Our Lady of Mount Carmel with the Brown Scapular." (Our Lady of Fatima, p.16-17).

#### **Ask the Apologist**

Dear Apologist, how do you respond to someone who says belief in God is an evolutionary instinct, or a trick our brain plays on us?

In a previous column we looked at how our culture tries to undermine our faith – not by arguing against it – but by trying to explain it away. One way of doing this is by saying belief in God is "a quirk produced by our neurology which was an evolutionary advantage due to its social and psychological benefits". But ultimately, they say, it is just an illusion.

A good place to start is by thinking about other beliefs we develop by instinct. For instance, we all come to believe we inhabit a real physical world which we explore by our senses. We also intuit that the other humans we see are real people with minds and first person perspectives like our own. In both cases these are incorrigible beliefs which are produced by the structure of our neurology... yet they point to something true. In fact; if you met someone who suppressed those instincts — and instead believes the world is an illusion or that everyone but him is a zombie - you would conclude there is something desperately wrong with that person. So even if one granted that belief in God is an inborn instinct, that is no reason to conclude Atheism is true.

Consider also how the presence of an instinct to believe in God is actually compatible with our worldview. If it is true that God created us and desires a relationship with us, wouldn't it stand to reason that God would also give us an ingrained intuition of His existence? I would be more alarmed if we didn't have one. So don't be intimidated by this challenge. Instead, turn it around.


