

THE INDIRECT OBJECT OF OUR THANKS

I loved my literature and grammar classes in high school. My sophomore and junior years of high school, we were still forced to diagram sentences in my English classes. Most of my classmates groaned when it came time to diagram sentences each day; but I loved it. In fact, I think it's probably accurate to say that everyone *but* me hated diagramming sentences. I'm okay with that.

Regardless, all that diagramming of sentences makes life easier. It made learning different languages easier; I still know whether to use an adverb or adjective in a given situation (though I'm sure I mess it up at times); I realize that every reflexive pronoun needs to have an antecedent or you aren't supposed to use it; and I remember what direct and indirect objects are. And that brings me to my subject today.

A direct object receives of the action of a verb. If John roasts a turkey, the turkey is the direct object of the verb "to roast." An indirect object is the recipient of the direct object. If John roasts his family a turkey, his family is the indirect object.

I know. You don't care. But, it's an important thing to remember. Every year, when Thanksgiving Day arrives and families and friends gather to spend time together and express their gratitude, I often think that we have forgotten about indirect objects in our culture. The idea of Thanksgiving obviously involves us giving thanks. Here's your quiz, what's the direct object in the sentence "We give thanks"? Yep, "thanks."

Maybe you see my point now. How often do we leave the indirect object out of Thanksgiving? How easy it is to forget the recipient of our thanks. We give thanks; but do we give God thanks? This Thanksgiving, I want to invite you to consider how to make God the recipient of your thanks – to recognize that from him comes every good gift; and that without him, we have no good things. As St. Paul puts it, *What do you have that you did not receive? And if you received it, why do you boast as if it were not a gift?* (1 Cor 4:7).

To help, here is a prayer to pray before your Thanksgiving meal, to be sure your gratitude is directed to the right place:

Eternal God,

from whom we receive every good gift

and who always show yourself to be a provident Father to us, your children,

We give you thanks for the many blessings that you have given us:

for the gift of the family and friends that surround us,

for those dear to us who are far away,

for the security and safety that we enjoy,

for the many material blessings that we often take for granted,

and even, Lord, for the trials and difficulties that we face, which strengthen us and cause us to seek you more.

Above all, we thank you for the gift of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord,

for the faith that brings us to know you,

for the hope that we find only in you,

and for your love that surpasses every desire of our hearts.

On this day of gratitude, we ask you to bless this food that we are about to receive;

It is a symbol of your abundant goodness to us;

may it remind us that you are the source of strength and nourishment

and that only in you do we find the fullness and peace for which we long.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. R. Amen.

Allow me to express how thankful I am to God to be here at St. Joseph with you all! Let's continue to pray for one another.
