Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A) 1 Kings 19:9a, 11–13a Romans 9:1–5 / Matthew 14:22–33

As priests we're expected to plan our own funerals, including the Scripture readings. As it happens, I chose the Gospel for this Sunday, the one about Jesus walking across the water and inviting Peter to trust and step out of the boat and come to him. You may think it strange for a funeral, but it's been pretty much the story of my life.

Often there have been times when I was asked to go where I didn't want to go, like Peter being asked to get out of the boat. Ultimately I realized that those were also the very times when I seemed most aware of God's presence.

Oh, I think God was always there, it's simply that my own ego often got in the way. It was when I gave in that I most felt buoyed by God. In fact, the least satisfying assignment was the one I eagerly sought out, and some of those I resisted turned out to be graced. Like Peter, it's good to do what doesn't alwavs make sense.

What does all this have to do with my choice of this Scripture reading for my funeral? Well, every time I have stepped out of the boat of security, God has been there to sustain me. I figure there is going to be no bigger "stepping out" than death, so I'm expecting God will be there as well.

At what precise point in the Mass does the bread and wine turn into the Body and Blood of Christ?

For many centuries, thinkers in the Western and Eastern Churches have pondered this question. Some say the moment of consecration happens at the beginning of the sentence, "This is my body." Others say it happens at the conclusion of that sentence. Still others claim it happens sometime during the sentence. The same theories were proposed about the consecration of the cup. From the Eastern Churches, the theory was raised that it wasn't the eucharistic narrative that was consecratory, but rather the prayer of invocation to the Holy Spirit known as the *epiclesis*.

These theories continue to be debated, but to what avail? Even the Catechism of the Catholic Church does not specify when the consecration happens (CCC 1375-81). But knowing the precise moment it happens doesn't seem to be as important as simply knowing that the elements of bread and wine over which the prayer is prayed do become for us the Body and Blood of Christ.

This mystery of faith, moreover, adds another dimension to our lives: transformation into Christ. Whether we share in Communion at the liturgy or contemplate the Lord in the tabernacle, the loving call of the Spirit is to change our hearts. Specifically, when does that happen to us? One never knows for sure. But by participation in the mystery of faith, we're changed ever more deeply into the One whose Body and Blood we share.

Liturgical Tidbits from Father Josh: "Let us Pray"

After the Introductory Rites, the priest during mass always addresses and invites the people with the words: "Let us Pray." The invocation of "Let us pray" is followed by a period of silence before the Collect (the Opening Prayer) is read. The silence is important because having just celebrated the Introductory Rites of the Mass, it is the hope of the Church that we have become distinctly aware of God's presence and the intentions we are now bringing into the celebration of the Eucharist.

The priest does not just go directly to the Collect or say "I am now going to pray," because he is not alone in the sacrifice that is to be offered. In saying "Let us pray," he is inviting the whole congregation to practice the common priesthood of our baptism.

Remember that all of us in our baptism are configured to the threefold office of Christ as Priest, Prophet, and King. And so, as the priest invites us with the words "Let us pray," we call to mind the sacrifices we want to present to the altar, the intentions we hold in our hearts, the prayers and thoughts of each and every one of us collected into one as the priest leads us into the celebration of the Eucharist.
