# Good News

Second Sunday of Advent (B)
Isaiah 40:1–5, 9–11 / 2 Peter 3:8–14 /
Mark 1:1–8

In 1992, Forbes magazine published an issue ti-tled "Why Do We Feel So Bad When We Have It So Good?" It featured articles by such luminaries as newsman Dan Rather, President George H. W. Bush, and author John Updike.

Many of the writers reflected upon our passion for more and our hunger to live in affluence and how that fails to satisfy. In so many ways, we as a nation find ourselves seeking distractions from living with ourselves lest we be confronted by our ultimate loneliness.

As a nation we are addicted to entertainment and smartphones, to drugs and pornography, to finding something new. We are confronted by rising suicide rates and a pervasive, deep-seated anger. Why are we not satisfied?

John the Baptist called the people of his day to repent, which is another way of asking them—and us—to look at life differently.

Advent is really about getting in touch with our deep longing for more, a part of our human condition that ultimately is only satisfied by God. We have been created to long for more, a longing that feels like loneliness, a longing that seeks to be satisfied. In the end, we can only find a sense of peace in the midst of such longing by accepting that it can never be fully satisfied in this life. Like the spirituality of Alcoholics Anonymous, accepting rather than fleeing from our human reality becomes a path to new life.

# dear Padre

Do Catholics have to marry in the Church? If a couple decides to marry outside of the Church, are they still allowed to receive Communion and other sacraments?

Catholics are obligated to follow the laws of the Church, including those laws regarding marriage. If a Catholic marries outside the Church, meaning that they did not follow Church law, then they may not receive the other sacraments until their marriage has been witnessed by the Church.

A wedding is a sacred ceremony for the couple, but it is also a ceremony for the Church. The Christian community is called upon to witness the ceremony, with the bishop, priest, or deacon called upon to bless the union in the name of the Church.

The Church can dispense from the form, that is, the place of the wedding, for good cause, and does so when necessary. When a dispensation from the law is granted, then the person has followed the marriage laws of the Church and is free to receive the sacraments.

A wedding is a sacred ceremony in which a sacrament is conferred. While the park may be pretty or the church down the street may be bigger, neither is a sufficient reason to ignore marriage law and marry outside the Church. --The Redemptorists

### Father Josh's Liturgical Tidbits: The Homily

You know it when you hear it! Many of us probably don't have a good consistent experience with homilies, because each priest has his own style and not every priest's gift is preaching. Preparing and delivering a homily requires putting together many different skills and types of knowledge: public speaking, creativity, knowing sound doctrine, the Scriptures, historical context, current news, and social issues among other things.

So what is a homily? A homily serves as an instruction, reflection, consolation, and exhortation within the liturgy. What makes it different from simple "preaching" or a "sermon" is that its structure must be found within the liturgy (mass, baptisms, wedding, funerals, etc.), and therefore must be done by members of the clergy who represent the figure of Christ. Its purpose, then, is to unpack the Lectionary readings of the liturgy being celebrated. A homily brings forth the timeless Word of God to our lives today, our lives as we live in the world, and our lives in the world to come. From the time of the Apostles, the Church Fathers, the saints of the past, even until today, it is a place of instruction for the faithful to know and develop their relationship with Christ and each other.
