Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Year B Journeysong 926

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) (B) Exodus 24:3-8 / Hebrews 9:11-15 / Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

As the story is told, two men were talking about why they go or do not go to church every weekend. One argued why he no longer comes to Mass: "I went every Sunday for almost thirty years and I can't remember a single sermon from all those years that I sat in a pew." The other thought about that and then replied, "You know, my wife and I have been married for more than twenty-five years. Just about every day during those years my wife and I sat down and shared a meal at least twice a day. Now I can't say that I remember more than one or two of those meals, but if we hadn't sat down to share those meals every day, I don't think we would still be married today."

Surely there are many reasons why Catholics come to the Eucharist each weekend. Some come for the homily, some for receiving holy Communion, others for the singing, and still others to be part of a faith community. For most, it is probably some of each. Yet behind all of it, though most might not think of saying so, is a commitment to be people of faith, to believe in the Lord Jesus, and to live as His disciples.

It is the same commitment the Hebrews made in the desert in Exodus 24:3: "We will do everything that the Lord has told us." Indeed, how long would we be believers and disciples of Jesus without being fed at His table?

Always pray to have eyes that see the best in people, a heart that forgives the worst, a mind that forgets the bad, and a soul that never loses faith in God.

Do we need both bread and wine to receive Christ's Body and Blood? If I receive only the host—not the Precious Blood—am I participating fully in the Eucharist?

By only taking the host you are participating fully. And if you only drink from the chalice, you also are participating fully. Christ is always fully present in each form.

Many times, it is not possible to offer the chalice to a large congregation. There are also times when one cannot receive the host, especially a person who is very ill, and consuming the Precious Blood is easier.

In the Church's teaching on the Eucharist, we are invited to receive both. The Eucharisticum Mysterium (32) says it is especially fitting to receive Christ in both forms during the celebration of the Eucharist. This allows the Eucharist to appear more perfectly as a banquet, a feast that is a foretaste of the banquet that will be celebrated with Christ at the end of time when the kingdom of God is established in its fullness.

In John 6, Jesus invites us to both eat and drink, so it is good to do both if you are able. If you aren't able, or if the chalice isn't offered at your church, you still participate fully by taking the host. Both forms are always present, because the priest must always receive both.

With the Eucharistic Doxology finished, we have now offered up to the Father Christ's perfect worship. It is time now to prepare ourselves for the reception of Christ's Body and Blood and to be united with Him in perfect worship.

The Communion Rite is threefold: The Lord's Prayer, the Rite of Peace, and the Fraction of the Bread.

All of this we will learn about in future tidbits, but for now, keep in mind that we are called to be properly disposed before the reception of the Eucharist, and so all of these preparatory steps are meant to dispose the mind and the heart to receive the Body and Blood of our Lord, worthily and fruitfully.
