Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Jeremiah 31:7–9 / Hebrews 5:1–6 / Mark 10:46–52

The story of blind Bartimaeus is an illustration of how we come to be people of faith. Like Bartimaeus, we may find ourselves helpless and on the side of life's road as we watch the world go by. And like him, we too then turn to God for help.

Just as Jesus called Bartimaeus, we may sense that God is calling us to trust and surrender to his vision of life for us. Throwing aside the cloak that he would use to gather alms by the roadside, Bartimaeus comes to Jesus. That simple action displays his willingness to leave his old way of life behind in order to follow Jesus.

This is how we come to faith—we are given a glimpse of life from God's perspective and must trust enough to cooperate with whatever God may bring our way. Such pivotal moments in life may come with the death of a loved one, the end of a relationship, or the loss of a job, when we need to trust that there is more to life in what lies ahead. Or it may come in those times when we need to learn how to cope with a lifelong illness, a failed dream, or growing old.

It's all about how we come to faith—by trusting that God will bring us to new life, even though we may be blind to the ways He will bring it about.

dear Padre

I am an eighty-year-old with painful knee replacements. Am I allowed to remain seated during Mass? Also, at what age am I free to watch a televised Mass at home instead of going to Mass?

Your health condition permits you to remain seated while others in the congregation kneel or stand. Of primary importance is your valued presence, and your full, active participation with fellow members of your Catholic faith community. At Mass, "the faithful form a holy people...so that they may give thanks to God and offer the unblemished sacrificial Victim not only by means of the hands of the Priest but also together with him..." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 95). However, if someone is incapable of attending Mass, then the obligation is abrogated, regardless of age.

The Church allows a televised Mass primarily for people who are homebound, in hospitals, nursing homes, and prisons.

"The televised Mass is never a substitute for the Church's pastoral care for the sick in the form of visits by parish ministers who share the Scriptures and bring Communion, nor is it ever a substitute for the Sunday Mass celebrated within a parish faith community each week" (Guidelines for Televising the Liturgy, USCCB, 2014).

If you are unable to be present at Mass, you have an opportunity to identify with a worshiping community, hear the word of God, be moved to expressions of praise and thanksgiving, and unite with Christ in spiritual communion. --Fr. Byron Miller, CSsR

Holy Day of Obligation: Nov. 1st (Friday) is The Solemnity of All Saints and a Holy Day of Obligation. Mass will be celebrated at 9:30 am and at 5:30 pm that day.

November is the month of All Souls: All Souls Day is Nov. 2nd. During the month of November, we especially remember our deceased loved ones. Here are two ways that you can do that:

- (1) <u>All Souls Remembrance Leaves</u>: We are continuing the custom in our parish of writing names of deceased loved ones on "leaves," which will hang on the "tree" in front of the altar during November. Leaves are available in the Social Hall: write names of your deceased loved ones on a leaf, and drop the leaf in the collection basket or in the basket in the Social Hall. We will hang the leaves on our All Souls Remembrance Tree in front of the altar, during the month of November.
- (2) There are also envelopes in the Social Hall for Remembrance of All Souls. You may write the names of deceased loved ones on these. Drop in any collection. During the month of November, Father will read some of the names from these envelopes and from the All Souls "leaves" during each Mass.

Father Josh's Liturgical Tidbits

The Prayer after Communion:

After the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ, the concluding rites will now wrap up the celebration of the Eucharist. The Prayer after Communion is said, and the priest introduces it just as he did the Collect at the beginning of the Mass with: "Let us Pray."

Remember, the priest, as he invites us with "Let us pray," is inviting the whole congregation to practice the common priesthood of our baptism. The Mass that he celebrated is not for his priesthood alone, but rather for the priesthood of all the baptized. Together they have made a sacrifice and partaken of it.

The Prayer after Communion wraps up the celebration. The priest asks that the benefits of the Eucharist will remain active in our daily lives. The prayer takes various forms, but will encapsulate all the fruits of the mystery just celebrated: healing of body, mind, and spirit; the forgiveness of sins; the protection of God; and the strength to go forward in holiness.

We pray that the Eucharist will strengthen us to live as Jesus did.
