

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Daniel 12:1–3 / Hebrews 10:11–14, 18 / Mark 13:24–32

When personal worlds collapse, we can lose our way. The stars that marked our path through life disappear. When everything in life on which we had depended is shaken, we can feel life is not worth living.

It happens when someone we love dies, when life-threatening illness lays us low, when a relationship disintegrates without warning. Then the world we once knew is no more. This week's Gospel suggests "when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates" (Mark 13:29).

But how can that be? I met Marguerite and Ken when I came to the parish. A short time later, I received a phone call that Ken had suffered a massive heart attack. He had gone down to the basement for something, and that was where he died. I spent some time with Marguerite, and as you can imagine, she was wrapped in grief. They'd had a wonderful marriage, she told me, had done everything together. Whatever one did, the other went along.

Two years later, Marguerite and I were talking and she began telling me how life had changed for her without Ken. She still missed him terribly. But lately she found herself involved in all sorts of parish activities and services she never would have gotten into, simply because they had always done things together. Without Ken, she found new worlds she never knew existed. For Marguerite, God had opened the gates to new life.

Are you ready? The Season of Advent and the beginning of the new Church year arrives on Dec. 1st!

I am confused by Genesis 6:6: "The Lord regretted making human beings on the earth, and His heart was grieved." How can a perfect being regret something He created in his own image?

Sometimes reading an isolated line of Scripture can be confusing. Context is essential. The Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum), promulgated by Pope St. Paul VI on November 18, 1965, clearly teaches this Catholic understanding of sacred Scripture.

A proper appreciation of context, in the example you provided, reminds us that the holy writers of Scripture were not reporting the words of the Lord like an announcer on the evening news. This is not a newspaper account of a witnessed event or a report commenting on the scene that has unfolded. Biblical authors were constrained by their own experience and perception, even as they were inspired by the Spirit of God. When they made a conclusion, they frequently revealed more about their humanity than they did about the divinity they witnessed. The divine is just too wonderful and mysterious for humans to fully compre-

The author of Genesis provided a summary of how the experience of the creative activity of God was perceived. It is not the whole story and is perhaps best understood more as a contrast with Genesis 1:31, where we read that on the sixth day, "God looked at everything He had made, and found it very good."

## Father Josh's Liturgical Tidbits

### The Prayer after Communion:

After the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ, the concluding rites will now wrap up the celebration of the Eucharist. The Prayer after Communion is said, and the priest introduces it just as he did the Collect at the beginning of the Mass with: "Let us Pray."

Remember, the priest, as he invites us with "Let us pray," is inviting the whole congregation to practice the common priesthood of our baptism. The Mass that he celebrated is not for his priesthood alone, but rather for the priesthood of all the baptized. Together they have made a sacrifice and partaken of it.

The Prayer after Communion wraps up the celebration. The priest asks that the benefits of the Eucharist will remain active in our daily lives. The prayer takes various forms, but will encapsulate all the fruits of the mystery just celebrated: healing of body, mind, and spirit; the forgiveness of sins; the protection of God; and the strength to go forward in holiness.

We pray that the Eucharist will strengthen us to live as Jesus did.
