

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (B) Daniel 7:13–14 / Revelation 1:5–8 / John 18:33b–37

We are bombarded by many statements professing to be true. Advertisers seek our endorsement, political parties seek our allegiance, and friends seek our agreement. Each purports to offer truth.

In the Gospel this week, Pilate asks Jesus whether he is a king. Jesus replies, "You say I am a king. For this...I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (John 18:37).

What is Jesus' truth? We tend to go through life taking stands on various issues: how to raise children, what kind of exercise is best, which political approach to endorse, and countless others. Once we decide, we often make that stance one of life's truths and proclaim all others false.

Jesus, on the other hand, offers His life as truth, much bigger than our petty truths. His truth stretches us beyond what we already are, more than life issues that change daily. His life's truth declares that meaning is found only by living for others, that loving someone can heal their pain, that wisdom is found in the struggle, that less is more.

Jesus' ultimate truth is doing His Father's will. The fact that it is difficult or that we tend not to live it very well makes it no less the truth.

When receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, I feel the need to respond, "Thank you, Jesus. Amen." Is this OK or should I just stick to "Amen"?

"Amen" is an appropriate response, in and of itself. An emphatic, heartfelt "Amen" is an affirmation of faith meant to capture our feelings of profound gratitude and awe in the presence of God. It's also a statement of belief, roughly translated as "truly," "most assuredly," or "so be it" to what has been said.

For example, when we conclude the Creed with "Amen," it repeats and confirms the first words "I believe." "To believe is to say 'Amen' to God's words, promises and commandments; to entrust oneself completely to him who is the 'Amen' of infinite love and perfect faithfulness" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1064).

"Jesus Christ is...the definitive 'Amen' of the Father's love for us. He takes up and completes our 'Amen' to the Father.... That is why we utter the Amen through him, to the glory of God" (CCC 1065).

Sharing in the one bread and the one cup is a time of unity with God and with God's people. Each individual communicant's "Amen" is also meant to be an expression of our unity together in receiving the Body and Blood of Christ.

Responding with something other than "Amen" may serve to disrupt that unity and draw attention to yourself. So, yes, stick with a sincere, mindful "Amen!"

Father Josh's Liturgical Tidbits: The Gestures at Mass

Now that we have gone through the different parts of the Mass, let's move on to the different gestures during Mass, starting with a general overview. Something that distinguishes our Catholic worship from other Christian services is that within the Mass we use quite a few different gestures: sitting, standing, kneeling, bowing, genuflecting, striking the breast, etc.

You may have wondered why we do all of these things in Mass and why not simply sit down for the duration. The answer is quite simple, really. We make gestures in Mass, because *they convey basic human emotions communicated through actions*. When the president of a country enters a conference room, most people in that room will probably stand in order to greet him/her. In the ancient world, if the king and queen is in someone's presence, then that person would usually greet them with one knee on the ground or by bowing. If a person is sorry for something they've done, one of the ways they can express their sorrow for their offense is to strike their chest. We do all of these basic gestures in Mass, too!

Remember now, whenever we're in Mass, we are in the presence of Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. We stand in the beginning to honor His entrance in our worship; we strike our breast during the *confiteor* to express sorrow for our offenses against Him; like Jesus' disciples, we sit down as we listen to His words and stories; and we kneel down as He presents Himself to us as our King and Savior. We don't make different gestures in Mass just because we're told to do it; rather, we make them because there's usually a symbolic meaning attached to them.
