



Good News

Fifth Sunday of Lent (C) Isaiah 43:16–21 / Philippians 3:8–14 / John 8:1–11

Sometimes human beings seem to be evolving into more than what we have been. Gradually, we become capable of experiencing more than what we pick up through our five senses. We listen to our intuition; we pay attention to our sixth sense; we discover a spiritual side to our personalities. More and more, we notice people in need. We find ourselves becoming better listeners as people unburden themselves to us. We may be more aware of some stirring deep within ourselves.

All such moments may be seen by people of faith as God bringing us to a new place in life. Just as Isaiah speaks of God doing something new among the Israelites in distant exile, God continues to guide us to becoming more completely human. By His life, passion, and death, Jesus shows us most clearly what sort of person our God is drawing us to be: compassionate and just, generous and merciful, loving in a wasteland of indifference.

So, when we hear the story of Jesus not condemning the woman caught in adultery, we may find ourselves becoming conscious of our own need to stop judging, stop condemning. Most of us have not yet evolved to the point of doing what Jesus would do. Instead, we condemn others while overlooking our own culpability. We are still in the process of learning to follow Jesus, to act as He would act, to love as He would love. It is God at work in us

A friend of mine told me he was looking forward to celebrating the Triduum. What does that word mean?

The word *triduum* is a Latin word meaning "three days." In this context, it refers to the Paschal Triduum: the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when we celebrate Christianity's most sacred events— the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

The official beginning of the Paschal Triduum takes place the evening of Holy Thursday, when we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This day is also referred to as Maundy Thursday, because Jesus gives a command (mandatum) to his followers to be an example of love and service to others. The Mass of the Lord's Supper ends in stillness as the tabernacle is emptied, and the altar is stripped bare. The priests, ministers, and congregation then exit in silence.

Good Friday is a day of somber quiet as we relive the passion and death of Jesus. The service centers on the solemn veneration of the cross.

Holy Saturday is characterized by a spirit of waiting and quiet anticipation until the festive Easter Vigil, celebrated in the evening, when the Church comes alive with the new Light of Christ and catechumens are joyfully received into the eucharistic community. These are the Christian high holy days.

Father Josh's Liturgical Tidbits No Meat Fridays

As we continue our Lenten journey, another act that Catholics do during the season of Lent is abstaining from eating flesh meat on Fridays. I once was told by a friend that he "does not believe in giving up meat on Fridays," and fair enough, because the practice of abstaining from meat is not really a matter of belief, but rather a matter of communion and discipline.

The practice of abstaining from meat has developed in our tradition as a recognition that on Good Friday, our Lord sacrificed His flesh for us and so we refrain from eating flesh meat in honor of him on Fridays. Giving up meat is a way for the Church to urge the faithful to have a communal penance during Lent: Together, as one Catholic people, we are united in doing a penitential act in this very special time of sacrifice and reconciliation with the Lord. Although eating meat on a Friday does not necessarily mean you committed a grave sin by rejecting the Church's doctrine; it does mean, however, that you have either forgotten or refused to participate in this united action of the Catholic people.

Remember, Lent is a special time for us to reexamine our lives to not only reconcile with God, but with our neighbors as well. Abstaining from meat for a time may not seem like a "big deal" in terms of the Church's beliefs, but it is a way for us to be in communion with the Church as a whole, and therefore contribute to the unity of Christ's body here on earth.
