



Good News

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) Genesis 18:20–32 / Colossians 2:12–14 / Luke 11:1–13

Consider how there are five levels of communication, each level taking us deeper into a relationship and what it means to be human. One, the greetings we offer as we pass: Good morning! How's it going?

Two, a sharing of activities: what we did, what someone said. Three, an expression of ideas, as in what we think about raising children or our political opinions or why we believe there may be conflicts in the world.

Four, revealing our feelings both positive and negative: feelings of love or gratitude or contentment as well as of being hurt or rejected or disappointed. Five, a sense of intense closeness and being with, perhaps even without speaking or using any words.

Each level, then, takes us deeper into a shared relationship. Consider, then, how ever-deepening prayer may follow that same pattern. One, memorized or rote prayer. Two, telling God what is on our mind, even though it is a one-sided conversation. Three, commonly called *meditation* but, more simply, thinking about God and life and our faith response, as in the musing that may follow spiritual reading.

Four, often referred to as "praying our feelings," such as reflecting on our human emotions and what they might say about us, our faith, and how the journey of our faith life is unfolding. Five, a sense of simply being with God, even without words, and simply resting in that Holy Presence. Each level of prayer, then, leads us ever more into a shared relationship with our God.

Who wrote the Lord's Prayer? I know the Lord's Prayer comes from Scripture, but who composed it as we say it today?

When the disciples asked the Lord to teach them to pray, He taught them the prayer we know as the Our Father. Two versions of that prayer appear in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. The version used in the Church's liturgies is derived from Matthew 6:9–13. In fact, citing St. Thomas Aquinas' Summa Theologiae, the Catechism of the Catholic Church calls the Lord's Prayer the "most perfect of prayers" (2774), teaching us not only what things to pray for in our prayer but also in what order, or priority, we should desire them. It is at the heart of every individual and communal prayer.

We pray the Our Father, bearing in mind and heart the intimate relationship we have with our God as sons and daughters by adoption through our baptism. The specific wording of our prayers is a work in progress. What we think of as the final wording is that which the Church has approved and makes the most sense for prayer as a community.

What is most important is that the substance of the prayer reflects the same matter the Lord used in the prayer.

Pray for our Sick and Deceased Loved Ones

Father Josh's Liturgical Tidbits: <u>The Lord's Prayer (Part I)</u>

The Lord's Prayer is the prayer that our Lord Himself has taught us and in many ways sums up the most perfect prayer to model our spiritual life and how we ought to pray. Many of the Church Fathers have deemed it appropriate that we incorporate this most perfect prayer as part our most perfect worship. It is a very fitting that we say the prayer our Lord taught us as we prepare for Communion.

Here is a very short breakdown of the petitions that we say in the Lord's Prayer: 1) We should desire the glory and honor of God as the first intention of our prayer, no matter what we may be praying for. Thus, we pray that God's name be honored and held holy. 2) Then we pray that his will be done as perfectly among us on earth as His angels accomplish it in His heavenly kingdom. There would be no point in praying unless we wanted God's will to be done. Nothing would be ultimately helpful to us if it were against His will, even if it is what we wanted.

3) After these universal intentions—for God's glory and for His will—we pray for the things we need in order to glorify him and be united to him. "Our daily bread" means all that we need to serve him here and now: first, his supernatural gift of his Body in the Holy Eucharist, and then the necessities of life we need each day.
