Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) Wisdom 18:6–9 / Hebrews 11:1– 2, 8–19 or 11:1–2, 8–12 / Luke 12:32 –48 or 12:35–40 FR.

When the British colonized India, they brought with them the game of golf. A worse hazard than sand traps turned out to be monkeys. Wherever the ball landed, a monkey would run onto the fairway, pick it up, and drop it somewhere else—from the fairway into the rough, out of a sand trap onto the green, from the green back onto the fairway. The Brits tried everything to keep the monkeys off the course—fences, sirens, booming noises. Nothing worked. In the end, they ended up changing the rule book: play the ball where the monkey drops it.

The scriptures today tell of people who lived with an openness to wherever it was that God would take them. They played the ball wherever the monkey dropped it. It is the story of the Hebrews enslaved in Egypt when they were about to be led out into a God-knew-where desert. It is the story of aged Abraham and Sarah, called to travel to an alien land and then into parenthood in their old age.

Faith is not trusting that God will always take us to where we want to be; it is trusting that wherever it is that God takes us will ultimately bring us into fuller life. So, watch and be ready to recognize the coming of God. It may be in times of darkness for you (as when the master comes late at night, says Luke's Gospel) or when you find yourself in an "alien land," a place in life you've never been before.

May the Mother of Jesus, and our Mother, always smile on you and obtain for you, from her Most Holy Son, every heavenly blessing.

Where did the Virgin Mary spend her last days on earth? Ephesus or Jerusalem?

Shortly before Jesus died on the cross, He entrusted His widowed mother to the protective care of John the Evangelist. (See John 19:26–27.) Accordingly, when John lived his final years in Ephesus, it is believed that Mary also spent her last days nearby in a modest stone dwelling, before being assumed body and soul into heaven "to be preserved from the corruption of the tomb" (Pope Pius XII, Munificentissimus Deus, 1950).

Moreover, it is likely in Ephesus (present-day Turkey) where the tradition of Mary's Assumption started. Pope Benedict XIV (1740–1758) declared Ephesus was "where the Blessed Mother...proceeded from this life into heaven."

More recent popes, such as Paul VI in 1967 and John Paul II in 1979, prayed in this venerable home, known as Mother Mary's House. However, close to Gethsemane in Jerusalem is the Basilica of the Tomb of Mary from the fifth century. It is built around an ancient crypt where Mary's body was believed to have been laid before it was assumed into heaven.

While both Ephesus and Jerusalem claim to be the location where the Virgin Mary spent her last years on earth, experts contend the latter is the older tradition and the more credible place. Even if Mary temporarily left Jerusalem, it is probable she returned to the land of her birth and resided there at the end of her earthly life.

Father Josh's Liturgical Tidbits: <u>The Lord's Prayer (Part II)</u>

We continue now our reflection of the use of the Lord's Prayer in Mass. Thus far, the prayer is all about positive things: God's glory and His gifts to us. But there are also obstacles to His glory and His gifts. These are our sins and other people's sins against us. 4) We need God's forgiveness for our ungratefulness in sinning, especially when we are in the act of asking Him for good things. 5) We have to be willing to forgive others if we ourselves want to be forgiven. If we can forgive those who have hurt us, we will be acting like Him and pleasing Him — God loves a forgiving heart. 6) But there is also the struggle against sin when we are tempted. While God does not tempt anyone, He allows us to be tempted. He created us to have free will, and so He wishes for us to be His friends and not His puppets. When we are tempted, we are in complete need of help and grace and He will be faithful to us in times of trial.

7) The last negative: there is the devil, our spiritual enemy who constantly tries to remove us from God's glory, His holiness, His kingdom, His Eucharist, His pardon, and His help. Although the English and Latin versions of the Our Father pray simply for us to be delivered from "evil," the Greek original clearly prays for us to be delivered from the "Evil One." Thus, our most common prayer taught us by the Lord Himself contains a little exorcism against the devil. And this exorcism is a great way to purify ourselves as we prepare for our reception of the Eucharist.
