

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): Adults inquiring about the Catholic Church with a desire to become Catholic are invited to call the Parish Center for information.

SPONSORSHIP: To act as Godparent for Baptism or sponsor for Confirmation, the sponsor must be a baptized Catholic, confirmed, received communion, and live a morally good life; and, if married, done so within church law. Ordinarily, the sponsor must be at least 14 years old. A Christian who is a non-Catholic may be a witness for Baptism together with a Catholic sponsor.

BAPTISM: Baptism is celebrated twice a month at 12:30 PM on the first and third Sunday at St. Brigid Church. Please arrange for the obligatory preparation session by calling the Parish Center.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: The Holy Eucharist and the Anointing of the Sick are available to the sick and shut-ins upon request.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their family life, to worship regularly at Sunday Mass, and to receive ongoing religious education in the years preceding the reception of these sacraments.

MATRIMONY: Specific times are set for the celebration of marriage during the year. To allow ample time for preparation, please contact the Parish Center at least one year before the intended wedding date.

TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9a

Isaiah describes the willingness of the Suffering Servant to submit to the persecution of his enemies. This willingness stems from true faith in God, and the knowledge that the Lord will always be his help.

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

James states that if some one is hungry and you wish them well but do not help them, you have done them no good. He compares this to stating your faith, without backing it up with your actions. He reminds us that we must show our faith through our good works.

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus taught his disciples that as the Messiah, he had to suffer much, be put to death, and rise three days later. Peter began to disagree and Jesus reprimanded him for judging by human standards rather than by God's. He told them that whoever would be willing to lose their life for the sake of Jesus and the gospel, will in fact preserve their life forever.

NEW DIRECTIVES ON COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS

The Bishops of New Jersey approved the return to the obligation of Sunday Mass effective June 5, 2021 with the following provisions:

- Occupancy restrictions for social distancing purposes are lifted (Executive Order of the Governor, 242 – May 24, 2021).
- The obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who believe they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious/contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult their local pastor if they have questions about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).
- The dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass is lifted for all in good health.
- Livestream Sunday Mass participation will continue.
- Those who are particularly vulnerable to the coronavirus such as those who are not vaccinated, or those with underlying health conditions may follow Mass at home via livestream or television.
- Those with a cough or fever should not participate at an inperson public Mass.
- Masks are not required for those who are vaccinated.
- Children should follow the same mask guidelines that they have at school.
- All are encouraged to use their own personal hand sanitizer before receiving Holy Communion.

MASK UP IN RISKY INDOOR SITUATIONS



Due to increasing COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, and new data suggesting that the COVID-19 Delta variant is more transmissible among vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals, New Jersey is now strongly recommending that both vaccinated

and unvaccinated individuals wear face masks in indoor settings when:

- The space is crowded
- There is close contact with others who may not be fully vaccinated
- The vaccine status of other individuals is unknown.
- Individuals that are immunocompromised or at increased risk for severe disease are present
