## From Father's Desk

My Dear Parish,

Do you know what the difference is between Singing At Mass and Singing The Mass? The answer will be the starting point for our next month-long class on Monday evenings. But, I won't leave you hanging until then and instead, I'll give you a preview here.

"Singing at Mass" versus "Singing the Mass"

At Mass, the main way we participate is by spiritually uniting our prayers to those which the priest is offering at the altar. By the power of the Sacrament, that offering—the priest's and the participant's—changes so radically that it really and truly becomes the offering of Jesus Christ which he made on Calvary, once and for all for our salvation. Then, by worthily receiving Holy Communion each of us becomes so united to the Body and Blood of Our Lord, that we abide everlastingly through Him and in Him, strengthened until the day we get to be with Him forever in heaven.

The prayers of Mass are so important and accomplish for us a share in the praises of God which reaches to the highest heavens that the prayers themselves demand to be sung. Singing the Mass is to sing the prayers of the Mass itself by means of which heaven and earth unite in praise of our Savior.

You may begin to see, then, how his is different from merely singing a song that I happen to like after the homily or after Holy Communion, or as Father processes in or out. The Mass itself is meant to be sung—perhaps not every last word, but at least in part. And what is meant to be sung are the very prayers of Mass as opposed to this or that song.

The Church for centuries has been singing the Mass, even before organs were invented. In fact, the musical term *a capella*, which refers to singing without artificial instrumental accompaniment literally means, in Latin, "as at church" or "as in the chapel," where monks used to chant the Mass and the Psalms.

I'd love to teach you how to sing the basic parts of the Mass. This will be the goal for our next class. I've been thinking about something like this for a while. I was pleased that some of you, also, told me that you'd be interested.

So, Monday, November 22, the Feast of Saint Cecilia, we'll begin our next mini-class. And, since Saint Cecilia is the patron saint of music, this one, fittingly, will be a four-week introduction to Singing the Mass. We'll meet in the hall at 6:30 PM and go for about an hour. Here's hoping you can join us.


