From Father's Desk

My Dear Parish,

Jesus saves us from an excessive and harmful love for our own family.

There is a natural inclination—probably one of nature's strongest—to risk one's own life for the sake of rescuing one's family. While this is certainly praiseworthy in certain circumstances, it is sheer foolishness when it jeopardizes the eternal salvation which God purchased for us with the blood of His Only Son.

The "one thing necessary" will always be to do our utmost to stay close to and to hear and to act on the Word of God. This is what we should desire for ourselves and for our loved ones. If we should act in a way that opposes the Divine Will for us or for our family, we should lovingly correct ourselves or our loved ones. By what means would we ever consider furthering the separation of our own soul or that of any of our loved ones from God?

The way we can overcome this very strong natural tendency to remain united with our loved ones is to offer them to God—even spiritually as Abraham offered his own son—confident that God will provide the pleasing sacrifice. This requires great faith. It may require suffering the hardship of alienation from our family. But since we have ordered it in accord with God's plan, we can have the peace that comes from union with Him.
