1. WHY DO YOU WISH TO BE CONFIRMED?
2. DESCRIBE WHY YOU CHOSE YOUR CONFIRMATION NAME (WHETHER YOU CHOSE YOUR BAPTISMAL NAME OR OTHER).
3. DESCRIBE WHY YOU CHOSE YOUR SPONSOR.

Essays must be typewritten and double-spaced.

Essays must have your name typed at the top of the page.

Essays must be approximately 250 words.

INFORMATION ON CHOOSING A SPONSOR

(Canon Law 8874)

The role of the sponsor in Confirmation is to ensure that the person being confirmed acts as a true witness to Christ and faithfully fulfills the obligations connected with this sacrament.

The sponsor is essentially saying “The members of the Church want you to know that I support you. I will be happy to guide you as we try together each day to live as Jesus Christ lived. I want to share the Christian faith with you.”

It is desirable that the Godparent at Baptism also be the sponsor at Confirmation. This expresses more clearly the relationship between Baptism and Confirmation and also makes the function and responsibility of the sponsor more effective.

To be a sponsor, a person must:

1. Be chosen by the one to be confirmed and have the qualifications and intent of performing the special role of a sponsor.
2. Be a practicing baptized and confirmed Catholic who has also received the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist and lives in harmony with the faith of the Church.
3. Be at least 16 years of age.
4. May NOT be the father or mother of the person being confirmed. A grandparent CAN be a sponsor.

ON CHOOSING A CONFIRMATION NAME

The Confirmation name is a sign that we are called by God. The idea of being called goes back to Old Testament times when again and again, God called the prophets by name. In the New Testament, it is Jesus who calls us back to God; it is Jesus who knows us and challenges us to follow Him. Thus, in Confirmation, choosing a name shows that God loves us so much and knows us so well that He calls us by name.

Your initiation into the Church, begun at Baptism is now brought to completion by your choice to be confirmed. God calls us by name to be members of God's chosen family in Baptism. Again, God calls us by name to complete our membership in this family through Confirmation.

As part of your preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, you have the privilege and responsibility, just like your parents did when you were born, to choose a name. Your Confirmation name should reflect your close identification as a member of the Catholic Christian community. The idea of choosing a *new* name is an option many Confirmation candidates choose. Your *new* name should be the name of a Catholic saint. You may also choose to keep the same name that you were first called in Baptism.

There are a variety of books and websites depicting the lives of the saints that you will find very helpful as you research a Catholic saint who inspires you. We have information about the saints also available in the Mulrenan Youth Center and are happy to arrange time for you to read about the saints.
