TITLE: Receptionist

STATUS: Non-Exempt, Full-time

LOCATION: Pastoral Center, San Francisco, CA

PRIMARY FUNCTION:

This job is to ensure safe entry and exit of employees – to screen anyone entering the building, to announce guests, to process telephone calls throughout the building, manage meeting space bookings and required technology services.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Telephone Calls
 - Screen and direct phones calls within the building
 - Give appropriate information
- Receptionist
 - Ensure safe entry and exit of employees
 - Screen visitors to the building
 - Welcome visitors and direct them to the appropriate offices
 - Contact police and other emergency personnel when warranted
 - Present a positive, cheerful image of the Archdiocese in both personal and telephone contacts
 - Issue parking permits to visitors (if spaces available)
 - Book internal meeting spaces and arrange for required technology

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- High School education
- A friendly but firm manner in screening calls and/or judging the nature of business of visitors to the building.
- Good communication skills, knowledge of the English language, clear and legible handwriting, common sense, telephone operator skills
- Knowledge of the Archdiocese and various departments
- Ability to handle different people and situations.
