#### Remembering Our Past...

For those not familiar with our history, here are a few highlights from those early years of the parish.

June 10, 1971 is the official date our parish was canonically established by John Joseph Cardinal Carberry. Cardinal Carberry invited the Redemptorists of St. Louis to staff the parish. Rev. Dan Lowery CSsR, the provincial superior, appointed Rev. Ed Nugent CSsR as pastor and Rev. Chuck Beierwaltes CSsR as associate pastor.

Washington School, then at the corner of Butler Hill and Kerth Rd., which is now the site of Orchid Terrace, was where the parish community gathered to celebrate the Eucharist. **The first Mass** was celebrated there on the weekend of **July 30-31**, **1971**. (Archbishop Rozanski will be joining us on Saturday, July 31, 2021 to commemorate those first weekend Masses.)

A residence at 5801 Kerth Rd. was purchased for use as a parish house. Weekday Mass was celebrated there until **December 22, 1973, when the first Mass was celebrated in the newly built church** on property that had been purchased by the Archdiocese from Charles and Henrietta Moll in 1967.

#### PASTORAL COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

This will be my last update article as Chairman of the Pastoral Council. I would like to begin by thanking Becky McDonnell and Mary Ann Schulte.. It has been a pleasure to serve with you. During these trying times, the scheduling and then cancelling of things made this last year a challenge; but you two not only persevered, but managed to make Mary Mother a better place.

In keeping with the by-laws, I am to provide a brief summary of events and/or decisions that took place over the last year. (1) Since all of our athletics take place with Assumption, we eliminated the Athletic Commission from the Council. (2) Every Commission was reviewed to ensure that each sub-committee, or area of responsibility, was assigned to the correct Commission. The major areas of change here were the responsibilities of Christian Formation and Christian Service. (3) The by-laws were reviewed and modified as required to be done every five years. Due to Covid, this effort had been delayed. The major change in the by-laws is that term of service on the Council in now three years rather than two. To accomplish this, we added the position of Advisor to the Council. This role will be assumed by the out-going Chairperson. The main responsibility of the Advisor is to support the Chairperson and Vice-Chair in administrative matters and to welcome new parishioners into Mary Mother. (4) A special committee was formed to evaluate any major expenses requiring attention in the next five years. (5) Parish Council is now referred to as the Pastoral Council.

The Commission alignments and the by-laws can be found on the Mary Mother website. As always, feel free to contact me should you have any questions. It has truly been an honor to serve as Chairman of the Council.

### Follow-up from discussions / presentations at previous meetings

Jeanne: Follow-up on contacting parishioners for updated information

Dave: Update on the Easter Signs. To be sold for \$5. We will order 500 signs.

Gary: Need for additional revenue for our Major Project Fund. It was discussed at the January meeting about having Mark Stevison help with a video. Discussion about asking parishioners to donate additionally for videos. Cross generational videos would be the best with a different person every month.

Gary: Final discussion on re-naming some of the committees that fall under Kim's Christian Formation Commission, specifically these two: Pro-Life vs Respect Life Apostolate; and Various Justice Issues will be called Peace and Justice Ministry.

Gary: By-law discussion. Please review the by-laws and email questions

#### **Commission Reports**

Admin/Finance: Third issue with the heating in the church this winter. The original systems for the Church and Reilly Center were installed in 2002, making them 19 years old. The problem seems to be with the gas ignition, not the air conditioning. Put \$55,000 to Major Project budget for 2022. Heating system takes priority over the parking lot. Hopefully we can get it replaced sometime this fall.

Christian Service: The commission is generally in favor of joining the South County Collaborative on Racial Justice and Healing. This collaborative was inspired by St. Catherine's 8-week participation in the Faith and Racial Equity program from Just Faith Ministries. There was discussion about joining additional racial justice organization. As to a spring event with the Rock Church, after discussion, recommendation is that this event should be spearheaded from Christian Formation. As the relationship moves forward with Rock Church, we all agree that a good spiritual foundation would be critical to growing that relationship between the parishes. Sandwich Shoppe has been halted because of a meat source issue. We have plenty of bread and cheese and will have to ask to parishioners to provide a meat.

Health: GreifShare: February 1st and continues through April, every Monday. Mary Ann McWilliams is able to volunteer for Blood Drive Coordinator. Next Blood Drive is May 11th. First Aid Bags/AEDs. We have been given a list of things that need replaced. We are going to reevaluate the needs of the different bags. There are 4 AEDs and we will be inviting people to look at them to get more familiar with them. Heart Month. We are adding some information to the bulletin and website for Heart Month. There is a booklet available at church from the American Heart Association.

Liturgy: Christmas Planning Team Need to think about pre -lit trees. The white manger scene that goes on the hill by the annex needs repair and painting. If we want to continue to put up lights outside in the trees, we will need to replace them all. Lenten Planning Team: Focus for the year will be "Turn to God with all your heart." New banners for Ordinary Time will be quilted and will cost \$1,000.00 each. There is a need to replace several of our vestments. It was recommended we put a cost of \$8,000.00 in the budget. Social: July 31 – 50th Jubilee Mass with the Archbishop and Reception

Youth: Events on dates in March.

Director of Faith Formation • 20 more people have signed up for Form.

Vice-Chair: Nomination Update – 54 adults nominated and one youth. 10 adults are a confirmed interest.

Chairperson: Call from a parishioner about leasing fields. Has to be used for athletics. Contract might prohibit leasing. This will be investigated. This will not be pursued. Advisor to call new parishioners – Welcome them/talk about their interests/contact appropriate Commission Chairs

Fr. Chuck • Holy Week Guidelines different for this year because of COVID-19. Discernment as a Council: Some Examples: The camera angle for the Livestream; Sacred Images in Church (At the last meeting, Liturgy Commission does not think the church space can accommodate statues; Votive Candles — electronic candles would be used. Space issue as well. It can work in a vestibule.

Pastoral Council Minutes - March 25, 2021

February Minutes Approved

<u>Follow-up from discussions/presentations at previous</u> meetings

Gary - By-law discussion - questions have been addressed. Parishioners cannot run as a couple for Parish Council. The Update is the source for all Commissions to communicate with all members of the parish. New By-laws are now approved!

Rob - Peace & Justice Ministry/Christian Formation/ Christian Service Items. Commissions are continuing to discuss what new organizations can be able to participate in their activities. Our relationship with the Rock Church takes priority. Building our relationship with the Rock Church. Zoom meeting went well. Looking at a program to participate together. Hopefully an in person meeting at the end of the summer. Food pantry is still doing well. Moving forward as Christian Service and Christian Formation together. Building the friendship in a social way could bring us together and bridge the gaps. Social Commission is willing to get involved as a resource and help. The Youth Commission could get involved too. . A proposal for the parish to lend its signature to a Pastoral Letter on Racial Justice sponsored by the Catholic Racial Justice Collaborative of the Archdiocese. The letter will be published on the diocese website. We will lead our support to the statement and to make a public declaration. We would also have to present it to the parish. Approved.

**Commission Reports** 

Admin/Finance: MAJOR PROJECTS: There was a change to Major Projects. The Annex "water " projects has been removed and deferred along with the drywall replacement and floor replacement in Youth Room. Potentially the laptop and projector will be next year. Replacement of the deck railings has seen considerable increase in cost. The replacement of the vestments for Jubilee which is over \$5000, can be capitalized. CELL TOWER - Parishioners are concerned about the undesirability of a cell tower. Public works and planning/zoning would all be involved. Athletic fields would be a great location for a cell tower. Christian Formation: Peace and Justice Ministry – first event will be a book study starting in late spring or early summer. We will present ideas for which book to use at our next meeting.

Christian Service: As to a spring event with the Rock Church, after discussion, recommendation is that this event should be spearheaded from Christian Formation. As the relationship moves forward with Rock Church, we all agree that a good spiritual foundation would be critical to growing that relationship between the parishes.

Health: COVID Vaccine Shot – 300 vaccines were distributed. All of the people who received their shot will be back on April 3rd. GreifShare: February 1st through April, every Monday. Blood Drive May 11th

Liturgy: During Holy Week, changes may be different from the way we have done before because of limitations because of COVID-19. Christmas trees are in the budget for one 10' and one 7' tree next year. New vestments are also in the Upcoming budget.

Social: July 31-50<sup>th</sup> Jubilee Mass with the archbishop and with a catered dinner. October 16 HOMECOMING EVENT- After 4:30 Mass, church picnic and big party to celebrate our 50th Jubilee! The party will be located on one of our parking lots, with overflow parking TBD. There will be food, games, and activities. Fred Bird is coming. There is talk of a surprise ending to the night. We are hoping this will be like a Mary Mother Reunion. Spread the word to all those who used to be a part of our community!

Youth: Activities and events to be held in April. Vice-Chair: Election Update - 185 votes have been casted. <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> are paper ballots. Ann and Dave are both keeping tracks of the vote.

Chair: Spoke with Ann about cell phone numbers listed in the directory. Two Numbers can be included if wanted. Contact Barb Foley to attend a meeting with Fr. Pete. They would like another Parish Council member to attend. Reflections / Updates from Fr. Chuck: Communion on Easter Sunday afternoon - 30 people have signed up so far. ACA begins April 17/18 - more electronic and mailing than in person. Narrowing the focus on several projects need clarification before committing on certain projects. Response to the Major Project announcement - cosignatures when being published to the parish. Your input on the possibility of leasing space for a cell tower - can be on the parish grounds or the field.

#### DIRECTOR OF LITURGY AND MUSIC

I've been asked a few times why we've changed the way we sing the *Glory to God* and don't do the refrain anymore. I'd like to take this opportunity to explain a few things about the nature of this hymn and how we're called to sing it.

The Glory to God is one of the earliest known songs of the liturgy, dating back to the second century AD! Throughout our history, this great hymn was sung-through, that is, from beginning to end without repeating any lines. It wasn't until the 1970s that composers started setting the hymn with a repeated refrain. But if you look at the text as a whole, there isn't even any "refrain" to be repeated! It's one prayer from beginning to end. Imagine if, when we said the Our Father, we repeated "Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name" in the middle and again at the end. That would seem strange and out of place, right? That's because the text wasn't written to be proclaimed or sung that way. The same goes for the Glory to God.

Now I realize that some versions of the *Glory to God* that we currently have in our parish repertoire are not written with the option to be sung-through. When that's the case (as with the *Mass of Creation*), we'll continue to sing it as before. But when it is possible to sing the hymn through, I think it's important that we maintain the integrity of the text. It'll take some getting used to, but I know we're up to the task. And besides, then we'll be singing this great hymn as the church intends!

One of my children has Autism Spectrum Disorder. A few years ago we attended a wonderful class to help him learn how to interact socially. The program used a scientific approach to personal interaction. These are the ideas that have helped me form rewarding connections with others.

- 1. An important goal of a friendly conversation is to find common interests with the other person.
- 2. When meeting someone new, ask the person about themselves and ask open-ended questions. Pause occasionally to allow the other person to start a topic.
- 3. Conversations should be 50/50.
- 4. Be on the lookout for someone who shares a common interest, and plan to spend time with them.
- 5. Join a group that piques your interest. Mary Mother has lots of groups from which to pick.
- 6. When you admire something about someone else, tell
- 7. Practice listening. The best conversations happen when your focus is on listening to the other person.

And we recently celebrated Confirmation with the 8<sup>th</sup> graders of the parish and Pentecost. Do you remember all the Gifts of the Holy Spirit? If not, I challenge you to look them up and decide how you can use these amazing gifts to better the world around you.

#### **TITHING**

### March 2021 – 4 Sundays - \$976 each agency

- 1. Feed My People Provides emergency food and many other social services to the poor in South County.
- 2. Energy Care Provides financial assistance for utility bills for those facing loss of gas/electric service.
- 3. Whole Kids Outreach Provides health and wellness services in five poverty stricken rural counties in southern Missouri, with a goal of preventing child abuse.
- 4. Bakhita Spiritual Companions Provides spiritual guidance and support to survivors of human trafficking.
- St. Pius V İmmigrant & Refugee Program Direct outreach to immigrants and refugees around St. Pius V parish. Direct services provided to the poor including medicine, rent, and clothing on an emergency basis.
- Marian Middle School All-girls private middle school in the St. Louis community serving urban adolescent youth in a faith-based environment.
- 7. People to People Direct aid, including medical, food and water, to the people in Haiti, 80% of whom live in direct poverty.

#### April 2021 - 4 Sundays -\$970 each agency

- 1. St. Augustine Wellston Center Helps support the members of the former five parish communities that merged to become St. Augustine Parish. Services include a food pantry, thrift store, employment counseling, health services and a GED program.
- 2. Mary Ryder Home Serves St. Louis' most vulnerable senior women, nourishing their social, physical and emotional needs, and enhancing their quality of life through compassionate care.
- 3. Peter and Paul Community Services Feeds poor and homeless in the community. Donations are used for food and supplies.
- 4. Most Holy Trinity Parish Assists an inner-city parish in the Hyde Park area in its efforts to revitalize the neighborhood.
- Jefferson County Pregnancy Care Center provides free services to women in crisis pregnancies. Services include: pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, parenting classes, diapers, formula, clothing, and individual peer counseling.
- Lemay Child and Family Center Provides early care and education to children in a diverse, nurturing environment, and strengthening families by promoting children's healthy physical, cognitive, and socialemotional development.
- 7. Holy Family Hospital Bethlehem Provides care to Bethlehem's poorest families, offering access to care, hope and support for families, especially related to maternity and infant care.

#### SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

During the first three months of 2021, SVdP members provided 582 hours of service and logged 890 miles. Food was delivered to 19 families (totaling 52 people). We made 27 phone visits (due to COVID-19) to assist 59 people for various needs. Because of your contributions in dollars, food and scrap metal we have been able to provide 188 of our Neighbors in Need with the following assistance: \$779 in utilities, \$9,100 in housing, \$1,000 for medical and \$180 to MSD. We also provided \$250 in food gift cards, \$150 in Walgreens cards, \$75 in QT gas cards and \$894 in food pantry items.

We twinned \$3,000 to other conferences from metal collections. We applied for several grants from the SVdP Council plus our SVdP District and received the following additional assistance: \$100 in Disaster Relief Food Vouchers and \$5,077 in grants toward rent. Thank you from all of us for making this assistance possible and for being the face of Christ to our Neighbors in Need. 
