PASTOR'S LETTER TO THE PEOPLE OF MARY MOTHER

In light of the wisdom that comes to us every year when we must Fall out of summer's warmth and longer light into "Novembering" and the coming winter dark, I thought it fitting to share some sights and sounds of my recent priests retreat at the great river's edge-- White House Retreat center.

The incredibly beautiful days and nights revealed God's summer whispering, "I am still here, walking into the winter with you." Even the full moon all that week announced how great the sunlight still was as it met each night. That beautiful symbol echoed for me every night, the great wisdom of our retreat director, Father Patrick McDevitt, CM, all week. He is a Vincentian, the order of priests who taught me in the Seminary, the Congregation of the Mission. They are the Community who 'mission' to train men how to be missionary priests.

Even in our local diocese, and in our own dear Parish, we are missionaries. If we are not, the parish begins to decline. The essence of being a missionary is owning the love of Jesus who has gone into the deepest winter darkness in us and then carrying that love into some very dark places in others' hearts. There are so many people living by their own poor lights who do not know and feel the enlightening love of Jesus yet. We missionaries at Mary Mother have resolved to carry that message into the lives of our fellow members who may know intellectually that Jesus loves them, but they do not believe it or feel it yet. I have seen it at every Parish where I have served, very busy with programs, activities and buildings, but not building up the Body of Christ within them.

The good news is there are many partners at Mary Mother who have resolved to bring that loving message to our members who have not really heard it yet, and there are so many more parish members who are praying for the Spirit to bless that missionary work within the parish. As God was so generous to us priests with late Summer's warmth on our retreat, so we, Mary Mother missionaries, must be saying to our fellow members who need it most, "I am still here, walking into the winter dark places in your heart with you."

Advent Wreath, Explained!

The Advent Wreath as we know it today is a modern spin on an ancient practice — or rather, several of them.

Christians have always utilized candles to illustrate the metaphor of Christ as the "great light" shining on a people waiting in darkness (Isaiah 9:2). Historians tell us that pre-Christian societies in Europe also viewed candles as symbolic of the coming light of spring, and may have used wreaths of natural material along with these candles. Traditions and rituals surrounding an "Advent Wreath" are often thought to have originated in the Lutheran tradition in 16th-century Germany. Today, Advent Wreaths are a practice embraced by most Christians in the Western world.

An Advent Wreath consists of a circle of evergreen and four candles, one for each week of Advent. Three of the candles are purple; one is rose, representing Gaudete Sunday, a time of rejoicing at the closeness of Christmas. In Catholicism, Advent Wreaths are blessed on the First Sunday of Advent. For Advent Wreaths in private homes, it is appropriate for a family member to perform the blessing. ©LPi





CONTEMPLATIVE CORNER

When undertaking a prayer practice, there is a natural human tendency to want to set timelines and goals. There is some value to this sort of self-imposed structure, as it can help us cultivate discipline and positive habits in our prayer lives. Nevertheless, we must always remember that prayer is ultimately relationship. As such, trying to predetermine a point of "arrival" that will allow us to proclaim "success" in our prayer is, at best, a dicey proposition. As we persevere in prayer, there will undoubtedly be fruits and signals of our deepening relationship with God, but it is entirely likely that those signals and fruits will not be exactly the ones we were seeking. Otherwise, we might be so vain as to imagine that the power in a relationship with the Divine comes from us, rather than from God. We also must never deceive ourselves into thinking that there is a finish line to be reached in prayer, after which no more growth and commitment will be required. Any married couple will tell you that even the longest and most dedicated marriage requires real work to keep it thriving. This is no less true in our relationship with God. Moreover, relationship, by its nature, does not develop according to plan, but is rather forged in the messy dynamics of give and take, three steps forward and two steps back, and gradual selfdisclosure. We must learn to be patient in prayer, as God is with us.
