

A LETTER FROM DEACON RANDY

I am sure that all of us are familiar with Mary's "YES" to the angel Gabriel. We actually heard the Gospel sharing this story with us just yesterday. This event known as the Annunciation is part of the Joyful Mysteries when we say the rosary and an important event in God's plan of salvation. This event is well known to almost all Christians, but what do we know about Joseph's "YES" which we hear in today's Gospel. In many ways, Joseph is God's "silent partner." We know very little about Joseph. Joseph says very little in the Scriptures. Even in today's Gospel, Joseph doesn't say anything! However, he does everything: everything that God asked him to do. I have always been moved by the relationship that Joseph had with God. How many of us would be aware of God talking to us in a dream? How many of us would trust our whole future to something we saw or heard in a dream? Joseph heard and trusted in what he experienced and then took action, the action that God invited him to take. We are less than a week from Christmas and only seconds and minutes from the rest of our lives. What is God inviting you and me to do right now to make Jesus present in our world today? Do we trust and believe Isaiah's prophecy that "the virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel" which means that "God is with us." Do we believe that God is truly with us? Do we know that we are God's beloved children? Do we believe that each of us is cherished by our God? It

doesn't matter where we have been or what we have done in the past, our God who is love always loves us. There is nothing we can do to make God love us more or to make God love us less. God is love and we are loved always! I hope and pray that each of us will experience the true meaning of this Christmas season. Certainly, we can enjoy our families and our kids and grandkids but let's not forget the God who loves us and calls us to make Jesus present in our lives.

Hopefully, we, like Joseph will awake and do as the angel of the Lord had commanded him to do. May this last week of Advent be a special blessing for each and every one of us! May each of us experience our God with us!




From the desk of Religious Education





FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Pope Leo XIV has published his first major teaching document, "Dilexi Te," Latin for "I have loved you," and subtitled "On love for the poor." In the first chapter, he affirms that, while love for God "is one with love for the poor," today, new and "more dangerous" forms of poverty are emerging, including the lack of material resources, land, rights and freedom. Poverty is created by unjust laws and systems that "favor the strongest," allowing a small number of individuals to hoard resources from our communities. As a result, we are seeing billionaires grow wealthier while more and more people struggle to get by. Pope Leo calls for a conversion away from these structures and attitudes that are "centered on the accumulation of wealth" at all costs "even at the expense of others." The pope goes on to state, "In a world where the poor are increasingly numerous, we paradoxically see the growth of a wealthy elite, living in a bubble of comfort and luxury, almost in another world compared to ordinary people. This means that a culture still persists--sometimes well-disguised--that discards others without even realizing it and tolerates with indifference that millions of people die of hunger or survive in conditions unfit for human beings."

As faithful Catholics, we must not turn away from those who are suffering in our own community and worldwide. We have a duty to speak out on their behalf and to seek just solutions to these injustices.

"Meals"

The "Meals" ministry scope is expanding to include "Caregiver meals". Initially, this ministry was created to provide seven meals to a parishioner returning home from the hospital or rehab after an illness, injury or surgery. We are now going to expand that to provide meals to "in-home caregivers", once or twice weekly, for as long as the caregiver would like to have this additional help.

We are looking for volunteers who would be willing to provide a meal once a week, once every other week, once a month--whatever you would like to do. These meals can be homemade or purchased restaurant meals. Once we build a group of volunteers who would like to participate/provide meals, we will contact you about the scheduling. CONTEMPLATIVE CORNER

Poet Sara Etgen-Baker reminds of the silence that preceded the great Christmas song of hope:

1428-THE FIRST NOEL

The angels did not sing. Not at first.

Their silence split the sky like frost on stone, a pause between the star's slow burst and the breath that would become the song.




Then~
