A Letter from Deacon Randy

"Who do you say that I am?" Well, who do you say that Jesus is? This is not a rhetorical question. This is a question that requires an answer. What is your answer?


Today, we celebrate two of the most important people in the founding of our Church, Peter & Paul. Sure, Peter got the answer right but how many times did Peter get the answers wrong and what about Paul who actually tried to exterminate the Church before it really got started. Have you ever thought about why God picked them for their roles in the early Church? Sometimes God can make some very interesting choices. If you were God, would you have picked Peter to lead the Church or would you have picked Paul to spread the Good News throughout the world?

What about you and me? What has God picked you to do? How many ways have we tried to ignore or turn away from God's call because we are not good enough or we are not smart enough or we are not powerful enough. Have you ever heard the saying, "God doesn't call the qualified, He qualifies the called." Neither Peter nor Paul had the qualifications, but they were open to God's call, and they trusted in God's goodness and promise. Do you know that God would not call you to do something that you cannot do? Are we open and willing to go where God leads us? The Scripture readings this week recounted the call and travels of

Abram who trusted God. As I reflected on these readings and this solemnity, I could not help thinking about Pope Leo. I wonder how he felt as his election was imminent? Do you think he felt "Oh Goody, I am the man for the job!" I would bet that his thoughts may have been more like "God, do you really know what you are doing?" No matter his thoughts, he was open to the call, and he trusted that God would equip him to do what he will be called to do.

Like Peter, Paul and Pope Leo, God can and does work through us (you & me) if we are open to His call. Don't worry about not being perfect or by having weaknesses. God can and does work through us, regardless of our past mistakes. God forgives and forgets our sins, choosing us not for our abilities but for what God can accomplish through us.

Food For Thought

A recent study from JAMA Pediatrics (peerreviewed medical journal published by the

American Medical Association) compared states with more or less permissive gun laws. Firearm injuries are the leading cause of death in U.S. children. In a 2021 policy brief, emergency doctors found that a child or teen is killed every two hours and forty-eight minutes. The new study looked at firearm deaths after a 2010 Supreme Court ruling that state and local governments must comply with the Second Amendment, but which still allowed cities and states to regulate firearms. This ruling led to changes "in both directions" with some states enacting laws permitting greater freedom and access. while others passed stricter gun regulations. Study authors examined data from 2011 to 2023, compared to the previous decade. States with the most permissive laws experienced more than 6000 excess deaths than would be expected based on the previous time period. Those with laws that were somewhat less permissive saw 1500 more deaths than expected, and states passing the least permissive regulations saw no rise in gun deaths among children and teens. Previous research has found that "child access prevention laws" are effective in reducing injuries and deaths. Access to free gun locks through police departments and

community organizations can protect our youth from gun violence, as can safe storage of firearms and ammunition. Groups like the Archdiocesan Task Force on Gun Violence Prevention and Moms Demand Action are great resources for more information.

FEAST OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL

St. Peter was a fisherman whom Jesus called to become a "fisher of men." He was the leader of apostles and is often mentioned in the Bible. He tried to walk on water towards Jesus and was also present at the scene of the Transfiguration. He denied Jesus three times when the Lord was arrested but repented later. St. Peter is the first Pope of the Church as Jesus called him the 'rock on which My Church will be built.' He was also given the Keys of the Kingdom of God. When the Roman's condemned him, he asked to be crucified upside down as he felt unworthy to die in the same way as Jesus did.

St. Paul is known as the 'Apostle to the Gentiles.' He was not one of the twelve chosen by Jesus. In fact, he had never met Jesus in person. St. Paul was a zealous religious man who wanted to destroy Christians. On his way to arrest them, he was struck down and heard Jesus calling him to become His follower. St. Paul went on to become one of the greatest Christian teachers in history. He travelled extensively to convert people and wrote letters which became part of the Bible. He was eventually martyred in Rome.

Scholarship Fund

Monsignor Edward Reilly Scholarship Fund

Scholarships are awarded to freshman attending Catholic high school in the fall. Parents or guardians of applicants must be registered members of Mary Mother. The scholarship will be awarded based upon financial need and parish involvement. Since its inception in 2003, the Scholarship Fund has awarded 32 scholarships totaling over \$60,000.

Catholic Faithfulness Scholarship

This scholarship was started last year to show our young adults that their Mary Mother Community recognizes them, appreciates their commitment to their Catholic faith and supports them as they enter a new phase of their life.

Applicants must be members of Mary Mother of the Church and enrolled in their first year of post-secondary education (college or trade school) for the academic year beginning Summer/Fall 2025 or Winter/Spring 2026. The primary criteria for scholarship will be active participation in Saturday evening or Sunday Mass at Mary Mother or another Catholic church (participation will be confirmed by a priest, deacon, or youth minister), active participation in the community, and financial need.

Parish Nurse's Corner

<u>Friday evening line dancing!</u> On July 25th at 7:00 PM in the Reilly center. Thank you to Sheila and Sherry for leading this upcoming event. We'll learn dances from beginner to moderate level. Please wear loose clothing and shoes that "slide" easily. This event is free!

Summer safety: Last week's extreme weather certainly acclimated us quickly. Planning a trip? Whether driving or flying, pre-hydrating 2-3 days in advance can help make it a better experience, limiting fatigue, headaches, swelling. Many experience swelling in the hands, ankles, and feet only in the summertime. Because our bodies are already "hot", fluid from our vessels will not readily leave the tissues and absorb back into the blood stream to the heart. Add gravity, causing the fluid to "pool" in our feet and ankles - we experience swelling. It shouldn't occur to the extent that pressing a finger into the swollen area causes an indentation, or "pitting." If this occurs and it's unrelieved by resting and elevating the feet at the level of the heart or higher periodically throughout the day, talk to your physician. Underlying cardiac, kidney and circulation conditions must be ruled out. With some conditions, physicians must instruct patients to limit the amount of fluids/day. Take care of yourselves and one another!

Contemplative Corner

Fr. Richard Rohr elaborates on St. Paul's instruction for praying contemplatively:

Paul says that you should "Pray with gratitude, and the peace of God which is beyond all knowledge, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:7). First, you must begin with the positive, with gratitude (which might take your whole prayer time. Second, you need to pray however long it takes you to get to a place beyond agitation, or to find "peace" (whether five minutes or five hours or five days). Third, note that he says this is a place beyond "knowledge," beyond processing information or ideas. Fourthly, you must learn how to stand guard, which is what many call "creating the inner witness" or the witnessing presence that calmly watches your flow of thoughts (mind) and feelings (heart). Finally, you must know what the goal is: your egoic thoughts can actually be replaced with living inside the very mind of Christ (en Cristo). This is not self-generated knowing, but knowing by participation—consciousness itself (con-scire, to know with). This is major surgery, and Paul says it all in one condensed verse!

Paul then goes on to suggest that we fill our minds "with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good, everything that we love and honor, everything that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise" (Philippians 4:8) ... If you don't choose love and compassion, the human mind naturally goes in the other direction.




