

A LETTER FROM DEACON RANDY

We hear the story of the Good Samaritan in today's Gospel. This is a story that we have heard many times. This is a story that is filled with many plot lines about which each of us could find plenty to reflect on. This week, however, my attention kept being drawn to a verse that I never gave much attention to in the past. Verse 29 of the 10th Chapter of Luke's Gospel says, "But because he wished to justify himself, the scribe said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Have you ever thought about or reflected on this verse? Why would this man want Do we ever act to justify to justify himself? ourselves? What does it mean to justify myself? As I reflected on this encounter with Jesus, I cannot help but think that this scholar of the law was hoping that Jesus would say to him that he was good, that he had done enough and did not have to do anymore. How often do we say to ourselves that we have done enough? I go to Mass every Sunday, I pray regularly, I give to support the Church. That's enough, isn't it?

In the Gospel story, Jesus picks a person who would be the last person that this Jewish scribe would consider loving, a Samaritan. The Jews and the Samaritans did not associate with each other at all and yet the hero of this story, [that was] told to the Jewish scribe, is a Samaritan. In spite of the animosity between their peoples, the Samaritan not only sees a need but responds to remedy the need. Who is the person or the people in my life that I find it hard to love? Is there a person in my life that I do not understand and that he or she just drives me nuts

or is there a person that has hurt me over and over again? Well, I go to Mass every Sunday, and I pray regularly, and I support the Church, so I have probably done enough, right? Jesus asks the scribe at the end of the parable which of the three characters was a neighbor to the robbery victim. The scribe responds that the neighbor was the one who treated him with mercy. Jesus then responds to the scribe, and to us to, "Go and do likewise."

Yes, we may go to Mass every Sunday and we may keep the commandments and we may do all those other things that we think makes us "good Catholics" but if we don't see everyone we meet, everyone in need as a brother and sister, as another beloved child of God and respond to their needs, we have not done enough! Maybe we can spend some time this week to reflect on who God has put in our lives who are so hard for us to love. Perhaps we can reflect on how much God loves us, even though we don't deserve it. May we ask that God bless us with the Holy Spirit to soften our hearts and to help us to love others the way that God has loved us and continues to love us even in our weakness.

CONTEMPLATIVE CORNER

Life experience will tell us that prayer does not erase suffering and hardships. In fact, the great irony is that prayer often calls us more deeply into them! As we grow in our contemplative practices, a common fruit is a keener awareness of God who is present always, everywhere, and in all things. As this consciousness of the truly omnipresent God progressively awakens, we start finding the courage to seek God in the places we have always been the moist afraid to look - the hurting places, the painful places, the confusing places, the hard places. The Church demonstrates this wisdom with stark clarity by displaying the image of the suffering, crucified Christ before every altar – oh, that we may not let the sight become so familiar as to blind us to its meaning and power! This awareness of God's Presence in the suffering is not a call to create or condone it, but simply to be honest and accepting of the fact that these experiences are at times woven into the very fabric of reality, whether we would have it be so or not, and to recognize the hurts as places into which the immense love of God can readily flow and be revealed. When we meet suffering with the welcoming stance of contemplation, we can recognize how intertwined is the heart of God with the heart of creation, that all the suffering of the world is God's suffering, and be ready to meet God and be transformed there.

June 13

ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA: On July 14th, we celebrate the feast of the "Lily of the Mohawks." St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American woman to be canonized. Orphaned by a smallpox outbreak, Kateri survived with severe scarring and impaired eyesight. Despite tragedy, she was a devout girl at a young age, often building crosses from sticks in the woods. When she was 18, she began secret instruction in the Catholic faith with French missionaries. Her commitment to Christianity and vow of virginity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers. She escaped to a nearby mission, where she attended daily Mass, taught the children, and cared for the sick and the elderly. Sometimes the greatest misunderstandings can come from those closest to us. Like St. Kateri, God invites us to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love. LPi

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The trustees of the Monsignor Edward Reilly Scholarship Fund and the trustees of the <u>Catholic Faithfulness Scholarship</u> are now accepting applications. These are two separate scholarship funds: one for freshmen attending Catholic high school and the other for young adults attending their first year of post-secondary education.

The names and data of all applicants and recipients will remain confidential. Application packets are available in the office or you may contact the office and request an emailed packet. Applications for both scholarships must be submitted by noon on **Tuesday**, **July 15**, **2025**. Recipients will be notified by August 4, 2025.

Monsignor Edward Reilly Scholarship Fund

Scholarships are awarded to freshman attending Catholic high school in the fall. Parents or guardians of applicants must be registered members of Mary Mother. The scholarship will be awarded based upon financial need and parish involvement. Since its inception in 2003, the Scholarship Fund has awarded 32 scholarships totaling over \$60,000.

Catholic Faithfulness Scholarship

This scholarship was started last year to show our young adults that their Mary Mother Community recognizes them, appreciates their commitment to their Catholic faith and supports them as they enter a new phase of their life.

Applicants must be members of Mary Mother of the Church and enrolled in their first year of post-secondary education (college or trade school) for the academic year beginning Summer/Fall 2025 or Winter/Spring 2026. The primary criteria for scholarship will be active participation in Saturday evening or Sunday Mass at Mary Mother or another Catholic church (participation will be confirmed by a priest, deacon, or youth minister), active participation in the community, and financial need.

Our brains and how we learn (part two): In last week's "corner", I shared simple thoughts about learning by repetition from infancy through adulthood. Research published in February 2023 was the most recent I could find on repetitious learning. It was broken down even further, describing "spaced" and "massed" methods. Basically, "spaced" describes learning small amounts over a longer period of time and "massed" describes learning larger amounts over a short period, similar to "cramming." The ability to retain or not retain what we are trying to learn is affected differently by these methods. I can provide a printed copy if anyone requests this research. Another article on a different aspect of how we learn, easy to understand, is on the www.agingcare.com newsletter titled "What to do when a senior repeats the same thing over and over." This information is beneficial to us all!

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

As we come to grips with the consequences

of the presumed passage of the so-called "big, beautiful bill," we again must acknowledge Church teachings regarding migration. A January 2025 statement from the USCCB reminds us that the root causes of migration must be addressed in order to establish just treatment of migrants. Migration has been a consistent phenomenon throughout history as depicted even in the Bible, including the fleeing from persecution by the Holy Family. An effective and sustainable response to increased migration, especially forced migration, must address the fact that people have a right based on their human dignity to flourish in their homeland, with migration being a free choice. When conditions for a dignified life are absent, countries have a duty to accommodate that right. There are multiple factors contributing to increased migration and it is often the only way to sustain or protect human life. The USCCB describes the following guidelines to be met in establishing immigration policy: enforcement should be targeted, proportional, and humane; humanitarian protections and due process should be ensured; longtime residents should have an earned pathway to citizenship; family unity should remain a cornerstone of the U.S. system; and legal pathways should be expanded, reliable, and efficient. Each of these guidelines, based on Catholic Social Teaching, is more fully described in the USCCB statement entitled, "Catholic Elements of Immigration Reform".
