

A LETTER FROM DEACON RANDY

We hear in the Gospel those words from the mouth of Jesus that many of us do not anticipate coming from Jesus: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" Jesus then goes on to say how He came to bring division, again, not something we expect to come from the mouth of Jesus.

Fire is one of the images we think of when we think of the Holy Spirit. I would imagine that we would agree that after Pentecost, the apostles were "on fire" with the Spirit and the love of our God and boldly worked to spread the Gospel and make disciples to the ends of the earth as commanded by Jesus. I have known many people who have come back from a retreat experience or something similar "on fire" with the Holy Spirit and their lives are changed once they have experienced that they are loveable and loved by our God. I think Jesus is telling us in the Gospel that He wishes that all of God's creation was "on fire" with and for the Gospel.

I think to be "on fire" for Jesus requires that we have experienced God's love and that we boldly share God's love. One of the ways we can do this is to actively participate in the liturgical life of the Church. Have you ever thought that you would like to be a Lector or a Eucharistic Minister or a Hospitality Minister or a Server or maybe a member of our Music Ministry? If you have, I invite you to make that desire a reality. Come to our Ministry Workshops this Wednesday evening or give me a call so we know you are interested. Some of you may think I cannot do that because I am not worthy. You are right, you are not worthy, and neither are

any of us currently serving in these ministries. There is an old saying that God does not call the worthy, He makes worthy the called. Some may think that they do not know what to do. Don't worry, we will train you. We all have gifts, and God gave us those gifts for the good of God's Church. Please share your gifts with your parish family.

Since being "on fire" for Jesus is all about being loved by Jesus and loving Jesus, we must be willing to love one another. I would like to share a passage written by one of my favorite authors, Henri Nouwen, about letting go so we can love.

"I have noticed in my own life that people I do not like, have power over me because I am always thinking about them. They preoccupy me and have control over my thinking. I find myself jealous, resentful, and vengeful. I lose peace. I am holding on to these people as my enemies. Loving our enemies is the way of becoming free of our enemies. We free ourselves by letting go, by loving them, by caring for them. One of the most beautiful things is that when we let the enemy go out of our hearts, by love and forgiveness, we are suddenly free to let that unlimited, all-embracing love of God pour into us. We become a new person every time we forgive an enemy, because we let go of the angry person inside who was holding on to fear. The core of our faith is to be free people-free to love every human being with the divine love that always forgives."

Ladies of Mary Mother, would you like to take some time away from your busy lives to pray, rest, and reflect on your relationship with God?


The weekend of the retreat is April 10-12, '26 at Our Lady of the Snows.

Last week, I shared my reflection on Sunday's readings. If I could, I would spend nearly all my time immersed in Scripture — it is so deep, loving, and captivating. We have such an amazing God, don't we? In this column, you can expect variety. At times, we will dive directly into Scripture, allowing it to speak into our lives and deepen our understanding of God. CONTEMPLATIVE CORNER

A Book Review

For those wanting to enhance their spiritual awareness and response to the world we live in, I recommend "We Make the Road by Walking" by Brian D. McLaren. Brian is an author, speaker, activist and public theologian as well as the Dean of Faculty of the Center for Action and Contemplation.

In his preface, Brian points out: "You are not finished yet. You are 'in the making.' You have the capacity to learn, mature, think, change, and grow. You also have the freedom to stagnate, regress, constrict, and lose your way. Which road will you take?" This book is written: "...to help individuals and groups seize this moment and walk wisely and joyfully into the future together." Having read about one third of the book so far, I can attest to the eye-opening, spiritually enhancing qualities of Brian's work.

The book is presented in 52 chapters generally ordered by the more popular liturgical year of Christian practice. It begins in September with some "pre-Advent" Hebrew scripture focus, and then builds around Advent, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week, Easter and Pentecost. It can be read weekly (which is how I have chosen) or several chapters at a time.

Each chapter begins with three bible passages to "prime the meditative pump"; followed by a discourse from Brian (who is very good at drawing out life principles and food for thought); and ends with some "Engage" questions – all of which have taken me to deep thought, self-examination and the desire to take action.


