# A LETTER FROM DEACON RANDY

Our Gospel today is all about being humble without that word ever appearing in the Gospel passage. I wonder how many of us have honestly said that I want to be humble. What does being humble mean to you? Today we hear Jesus say that you should always take the lowest place so that you escape the potential embarrassment of that spot being saved for someone else. Jesus also suggests that we should take the lower place so that we can receive the honor of being asked to move up to a higher place in front of all our friends. Is that what it means to be humble? I really do not think so. The Mirriam Webster Dictionary tells us "To be humble means to be not proud or haughty, not arrogant or assertive. A humble person acknowledges their limitations and imperfections, appreciates others' strengths and values learning and growth over seeking personal glory. Humility involves a mindset of service rather than dominance, allowing for openness to new ideas." Why do you think that Jesus instructs the person giving the dinner to invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind? Could it be that Jesus knows that these folks possess a wisdom that could benefit you and me?

Do we realize that only God can humble us and only God can exalt us? Do we realize that left to our own designs, we are helpless, but God's grace can always lift us up to do more? Can we trust God to care for us in all matters? The Gospels are based on God's love for us. Love is about self-giving, and self-giving is all about self-forgetting. If we are truly honest, you and I are the poor, the crippled, the

lame and the blind when we are before God. We belong to a Church of the poor, a Church of the crippled, lame and blind. The beauty of God's love is that we are all invited to the Eucharistic banquet where no one is excluded because of these limitations. In the Risen Jesus, we are healed of all our infirmities and sins.

Jesus is inviting you & me to choose a life of humility and generosity, just as He did. He calls us not to set ourselves apart as being special. Rather, Jesus calls us to get to know the "invisible" people who are usually left out or not seen. May we care for the poor. May we spend time with those who live on the margins. May we learn their names and stories.

Today is the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month and we will be taking up a 2<sup>nd</sup> collection to benefit our St. Vincent de Paul's efforts to help our neighbors in need. Your generosity of financial resources is truly appreciated by SVDP and the other charities we support but have you ever thought about donating some of your "very precious" time to actually meet and receive some of the wisdom the poor, the marginalized, the lame and the blind have to offer us? Perhaps we could volunteer to help the Mary Mother Chapter of St Vincent de Paul or the St Anthony's Food Pantry or the James II Project or any one of the many groups working so hard to help those in need.

### **CONTEMPLATIVE CORNER**

God's mercy is freely given – perhaps the deepest meaning of the cross. The only "barrier" to God's mercy is our willingness to allow, accept, and welcome it. Yet, this "barrier" proves significant to so many, who have misunderstood mercy as somehow a response to some intention or behavior on our part, rather than as intrinsic to the Triune God, whose very nature it is to pour forth in love. We who constantly feel personal, cultural, and societal pressure to do more and be more are not prepared for unconditional mercy. We often struggle with the notion that God's mercy will *always* be unearned – as if anything we do could ever match the sheer immensity of Divine Love!

Part of the wisdom of Centering Prayer and other apophatic (without thoughts, words, or images) prayer forms is precisely that these forms recognize that the flow and energy of mercy is entirely one-sided, and no action on our part, however well-intended or ill-advised, will ever increase or decrease that flow. Indeed, one of the most common concerns expressed by new practitioners of Centering Prayer is the feeling of "not doing anything," and in essence, that feeling is correct! We don't do anything during Centering Prayer and other similar prayer types because there is nothing to do other than allow the grace, love, and mercy that God is. We recognize the minuteness of our doings vis-à-vis God and stop trying to measure up — and from there the grace flows!

# Calling all Musicians and Singers



Have you considered joining one of our Music Ministry groups? This is a great time to join us, and we are always willing to train. Here are some ways we hope you'll consider participating:

# FOOD FOR THOUGHT

According to Feeding America, a nationwide network of food banks (like the St. Louis Area Foodbank) and pantries, last year their

network of over 200 food banks and meal programs sourced, received and distributed more than seven billion pounds of food. They hope to dispel myths about food banks to bring attention to the critical needs they serve. For example, it is a common misconception that food banks only distribute non-perishable items; in fact, many food banks distribute fresh produce, lean proteins, and dairy. It is also a myth that food insecurity is only about hunger; many food banks offer nutrition education, medically tailored meals and connections to healthcare. 47 million people in the U.S. face daily challenges with hunger and its social and health impacts. Over 13 million children, one in five, don't have enough food to grow up strong, and no county in this country is untouched by hunger. Despite the great need for food assistance in our communities, Congress is considering deep cuts to SNAP, the program that helps over 47 million people buy groceries. Last year, SNAP provided nine times the number of meals than the Feeding America network. To truly end hunger, we need both local charities and strong federal programs working together. In addition to the help provided by MMOC parishioners to area food pantries and generous donations to parish food drives, we can also urge our legislators to continue support for SNAP.

# **Recycle Plastic Toothbrushes**

Did you know over 1bilion plastic toothbrushes are thrown away each year in the U.S. alone. Made from plastic nylon bristles and polypropylene handles, they basically never biodegrade. Most are nearly impossible to recycle due to their mixed materials and small size, so they nearly always end up in landfills, incinerators or oceans once we are done with them. At Mary Mother we have a program to recycle used **toothbrushes**, **as well toothpaste tubes**, **floss containers and floss picks**. A dentist with TerraCycle has developed a method of recycling these items. There is a container in the vestibule between the wire food crate and the bookshelves for your donations.


