



I felt like the wedding of this young couple, Zach and Madison Seiler, who will soon be joining our Parish and raising children here, was renewing my priesthood and joining in the renewal somehow, that was happening at the parish at the same time!

How wonderful is God who brings together all things, even where they seem to be apart?

# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & FAMILY CATECHESIS



#### From the Desk of Religious Education

The Parish School of Religion is officially underway, and I could not be more grateful and excited to journey with you through this new school year. As we prepare our own hearts—and the hearts of our children—for deeper faith, we turn to this Sunday's Gospel from Luke 14:27:

"Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."

This verse always leaves me a little breathless. Jesus speaks so plainly: true discipleship requires total dedication. We cannot cling to possessions, comfort, or even our own plans if we are to follow Him. And on top of that, He asks us to willingly carry our crosses. In our culture of instant gratification and convenience, this feels almost impossible—radical, even.

But here's the beautiful mystery: what seems radical is actually the way to true freedom. To be a disciple is not to lose, but to gain. It is to surrender the illusion of control and instead receive the abundance of God's grace. It is to discover that, in Christ, our daily choices are not burdens but opportunities to walk hand-in-hand with Him. So this week, I invite you to look at your own cross—not as a weight to resent, but as a doorway into deeper communion with the Father. What might discipleship look like in your home, your work, or your relationships if you embraced it fully, trusting that God never takes without giving even more in return?

May this Gospel remind us that true discipleship, while costly, is never without reward. In giving all to Christ, we gain everything.

#### CONTEMPLATIVE CORNER

Though Christianity has deep contemplative roots, contemplative insights and experiences can radically alter our concepts and perceptions of God to something beyond those typical to the Western Christian culture in which most of us were formed – not that these concepts and perceptions are wrong as far as they go, but more that they are inadequate to express the sheer depth and breadth of Divine Love.

To say 2 + 2 = 4 is completely true, but that mathematical insight alone hardly prepares one for calculus, because the tools, and the experience in the arena of mathematics for one that only knows addition, aren't equal to the task.

Likewise, contemplative practitioners, even (and especially!) seasoned practitioners can struggle to articulate and even comprehend their own experiences and the shared wisdom of fellow contemplatives because the realm of contemplation is so beyond the bounds of what has come before.

Contemplative author Carl McColman likens contemplative experience to visiting a foreign country: "There are so many differences big and small (different traffic laws, different money, different social customs, different shopping and dining establishments, subtle differences even when the language is the same, and so forth). We call this "culture shock"... So I think there's a bit of 'spiritual culture shock' when Christians write about [contemplative experience]." In overcoming this culture shock, we must be patient with ourselves and others as we navigate this "new land" together, and we must realize that no amount of study or discussion on contemplation can substitute for experience.

# **Calling all Musicians and Singers**

Have you considered joining one of our Music Ministry groups? This is a great time to join us, and we are always willing to train. Here are some ways we hope you'll consider participating:

**Traditional Choir** – this four-part harmony group sings selections in many different styles, from traditional hymns to gospel favorites to contemporary worship songs. They practice on Wednesdays at 7pm and sing about 3 times a month, at various Mass times.

**Contemporary Choir** – this choir leads mostly contemporary worship songs and are joined by guitarists and other instrumentalists. They practice on Thursdays at 7pm and sing about 3 times a month, at various Mass times.

**Teen Choir** – this is a newly forming group of youth singers and instrumentalists that will occasionally meet to offer their musical gifts at Mass. All high school age musicians are welcome!

**Resurrection Choir** – this choir is on call to support grieving families during funeral liturgies. There are no rehearsals, but they do gather right before Mass for a short practice.

**Cantors** – singers who lead the assembly in song when there is no choir present. Confidence in singing solo is helpful in this ministry.

**Instrumentalists** – we welcome parishioners high school and above, who play musical instruments to accompany at our Masses.




