A LETTER FROM DEACON RANDY

This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. For my reflection this week, I would like to share with you most of what Fr. Don Wester wrote in his article in the Review last week because he is spot on & something that each of us needs to hear.

"It is so simple and uncomplicated to hear that God sent Jesus to save us; we might be tempted to rejoice in the gift of salvation without also taking the responsibility that comes with it. Of course, we want to celebrate that gift, because it is the gift that ultimately sets us free. Our own good deeds are not what saves us. Following all the commandments is not what saves us. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy are not what saves us. Praying and fasting are not what saves us. All of those practices ought to flow out of the gift that we've been given. If we have been loved so deeply and eternally, why wouldn't we freely give of ourselves to others? I think we all know the answer to that, and it's why we don't hear the second half of this message from John 3:16.

We all remember the various phases of the Last Supper. Bread was broken, the cup was shared, and Jesus gave us the gift of His real presence with us. At that same dinner, He took off His outer garment, wrapped a towel around His waist and took up the basin and began to wash the disciples' feet. Even though they protested and thought it was inappropriate for a rabbi to do that, He did it anyway. We hear that He is trying to teach them a lesson through this experience. 'What I have done, you must do.' The gift of Jesus in our lives doesn't just free us, but it also gives us the mission for our lives. Among that group of people whose feet Jesus washed, there was a betrayer and the rest who fled when things got difficult. He washed their feet; there was no exclusion in his generosity and compassion.

As we exalt the cross of Jesus Christ this weekend, let us embrace the whole message of the cross and not just one convenient part of it. There are betrayers and those who have abandoned us among our family, friends and in the community at large. We've all experienced that in family, in government, in the Church and in our places of work. It breaks our heart when it happens, and we are tempted to be cynical, bitter, revengeful or even sometimes choose to isolate ourselves. The fact that Jesus went to the cross and died for all, without exclusion, should be the criteria out of which we live our mission.

We don't see a lot of examples of people among us who are exulting the cross and living the mission of Jesus in that way. In fact, it feels like swimming upstream to love our enemies, to welcome strangers, to share with those who have nothing to give us in return and to forgive sinners readily. Instead, we experience divisions, mistrust, hatred and violence. We can look at the big picture and become discouraged, or we can look at our own lives and make a choice to live our mission clearly. We need to do what we can, as we can, to make sure that we are carrying the cross as Jesus did. We may feel like we're alone when we start doing this, but just know that love attracts love. There will be some who see what we do, join us in the mission and in that way, give glory to God. What better way is there to spend our lives!"

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & FAMILY CATECHESIS

From the Desk of Religious Education

Psalm 51 reminds us that true repentance, when it comes from the heart, opens the door to God's renewal and healing. I often find myself praying, "Lord, You really do hear us down here, don't You?" And the truth is—He does. He knows the chaos of our schedules, the weight of our responsibilities, and the deep desire we carry as parents to raise our children in the faith. As a mom of four, I know what Monday nights can feel like—rushing out the door, getting kids where they need to be, and sometimes just wanting a moment of peace in the car while they're in class. I've been there! But I've also learned how powerful it is when I step inside, set my phone down, and let God speak into my own heart, too.

That's why I'm so excited that **PSR begins this Monday, September 15th, at 6:15 p.m.** We call it the Parish School of Religion because faith formation is meant for the whole parish family—not just the kids. While your children are in class, I want to invite you to join us for Alpha for Adults. It's a space to share a meal, grow in faith, and connect with others who are walking the same parenting journey.

Here's what I've seen in my own family: when parents grow in their faith alongside their children, something shifts at home. Conversations become deeper, sacraments carry more meaning, and the whole family draws closer to Christ together. I know it's not always easy, and sometimes just showing up feels like a victory. But hear this—you are already doing something extraordinary by being here with your child. And God wants to fill your heart with the same love, joy, and peace you pray He gives your children.

So this Monday, don't stay in the car. Come in. Share the meal with us, meet other parents, and let God do the rest. He really does love you—and He delights in renewing your spirit just as much as your child's.

CONTEMPLATIVE CORNER

Jesus tells us that "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13) and challenges us, "As I have loved you, so you must love one another" (Jn 13:34). He then lives out this kind of love dramatically in his passion and death, letting go of literally everything including his physical being, of course, but also respect, esteem, security, comfort, power, human friendship, and anything that satisfies the ego. We recognize the impossibility that we, of our own will, could ever love as freely and as perfectly as Jesus on the cross - indeed, that's one of the big points, that only God is capable of true selfless love, and we can love like God only in the measure we surrender to God. But it would be a mistake to assume that we can only truly love "as I have loved you" by "laying down" our physical life. Rather, we are graced at every moment with opportunity to embrace the dying of our egotistical "false self" through detachment from security, belonging, and control. Centering Prayer and other contemplative practices are our training in living truly "openhanded," meaning that we can welcome whatever God would place in our hand – even if that is a cross – and we can allow God to remove anything from our hands – even that which we convince ourselves is the basis of a good life... but is less than the infinite love of God.




