

PASTOR'S LETTER TO THE PEOPLE OF MARY MOTHER

Last week at Mass I mentioned a number of launches or lifting up actions at the Parish, in light of Christ promising we can be "lifted up" with Him. Just some of these exciting upliftings are:

- -Applying the Alpha retreat in a new way to the Catholic faith formation of our young families who are bringing a child to a Sacrament;
- -The startup of a Vocations Committee;
- -Some exciting initiatives by our Respect Life and Peace and Justice Ministries.

I did not even mention last week, the refreshing approach to the annual Stewardship message you will hear next weekend.

I'm excited about all of this, but I was especially inspired to get to meet with several people who are helping to create a Vocations Committee. This committee will be discerning about the best ways at Mary Mother for our community to call forth leadership vocations - religious, priests, single lay persons in Apostolic service, and couples who are married in Christ.

There were four kinds of actions that have to happen for any of us to be called into a leadership role in the Church:

- -Prayer
- -Affirmation
- -Invitation
- -Follow up

First, somebody had to be praying for us. Second, somebody had to notice we had certain gifts that suggested a special vocation and affirm us about those gifts. Third, somebody had to invite us into formation of some kind to help us discern if we should consider entering into formal training and formation. Finally after we tried the introductory formation program, someone had to follow up and keep praying for us and affirming us and encouraging us to keep going and to trust God with the direction of our lives and to accept the vocation that we were finally given by the Lord.

Since we all know nothing good moves forward without lots of prayer, that is the first action the new Vocations Committee will be calling for at Mary Mother. They will organize ways for the whole worship community to be praying all together for leadership vocations to come forth from our parish. The first prayer initiative for leadership vocations will be a simple prayerful action that will take place at 11:00 a.m. Mass September 28th, fittingly, Stewardship Sunday. You will get to meet all the members of the Vocations Committee when they have had a chance to meet and get to know each other a little bit longer. In the meantime pray for the Spirit to bring fruitfulness to their important work.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & FAMILY CATECHESIS

From the Desk of Religious Education

This Sunday's Gospel may sound confusing at first — Jesus tells the parable of a dishonest steward who uses shrewdness to save himself from trouble. But Jesus isn't praising dishonesty; He's asking us to be just as intentional and wise when it comes to living out our faith as we are about worldly concerns.

This Sunday is also a good time to talk to children about stewardship (given that our Stewardship weekend is underway) — that all we have comes from God, and we are called to use our gifts wisely. You can ask:

- How can we use our time to serve others? Do we opt in for the sake of others, not our own?
- Do we say thank you to God for what we have?

Even very young children can grasp the idea that everything we have is a gift meant to be shared.

Let's raise children who know how to serve God — not "mammon" — and who learn, from us, how to be trustworthy in all things.

As you focus on nurturing your child's faith, we also want to invite you to Alpha for Adults — a place where you can grow in your own faith and build community with other parents.

This **informal but very necessary session** is designed for parents, **especially those with children in a sacramental year (First Communion or Confirmation)**, to deepen your own understanding of the Catholic faith. Gatherings are on Mondays during PSR, so it's easy to attend while your child is in class. Whether you're new to the faith or a lifelong Catholic, Alpha is for everyone! It's an opportunity to explore faith in an open, relaxed environment while journeying WITH your 8th grader OR preparing your future 8th grader for the encounter you get to experience first. I joined my 13 year old in Alpha Youth at home so that I too can journey with YOU and our conversations have grown deeper and easier.


