A Story Only You Can Tell

Most people don't remember sermons.

But almost everyone remembers a story.

Imagine sitting at the kitchen table with your grandchild and telling them about one moment when God helped you — the prayer whispered in worry, the peace that came when you didn't expect it, the quiet nudge that guided a decision.

That story may stay with them longer than anything else you ever teach them.

Because faith grows best when it's **told, not just taught.**

Your Story Matters

Scripture tells us:

"Make them known to your children and to your children's children" (Deut 4:9).

God works in every life — sometimes in dramatic ways, but often in small, quiet moments. When you share those moments, you help your family see that faith isn't just something from church. It's something that lives inside ordinary days.

You don't need perfect words.

Two sentences are enough.

"Here's what happened."

"Here's how I knew God was there."

That's all it takes.

Ways to Share Your Faith Story

- **Keep it short** – One small moment is enough
- **Be real** – Share struggles as well as blessings
- **Connect it to them** – Show how God gave you courage, peace, or hope
- **Write it down** – A note or letter can become a treasure for years
