



"We are called to a community of love: the Trinity." (Roman)

Today we celebrate the Central Mystery of our Faith in the Most Holy Trinity!

Storytelling on the Gift of the Spirit

(continued from last week)

It's been 26 years since I welcomed the Holy Spirit into my heart and in addition to those 2 prayers, he has been performing miracles on a daily basis in my life. I consider it a miracle when I'm moved to get up early in the morning to receive our Lord in the real presence of the Holy Eucharist. I have come to realize through the years that when I consume him into my body, he becomes a part of me. When that happens he slowly transformed my whole being and it is no longer I who live, but he who lives in me. The fruits of the Holy Spirit - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control, began to be manifested in the way I act, speak, think, and in my interaction with people. I began to look at the opposite sex in the way our Lord looked at them. I have come to look at pornography and lust with distaste. One day, I was convicted by the Holy Spirit to get rid of my priced collection of Playboy magazines, which was a sad day for me, but once I made the decision, I felt liberated. I even contemplated giving them away to my non-Christian friends, but I didn't want to be the cause of them committing a mortal sin. The manifestation of the Holy Spirit in my life and transforming me into the person that I have now become was the first miracle and prayer request that was answered.

Because of the peace from having the Holy Spirit in my life, my demeanor changed and my family, and most importantly my father, noticed a change in my attitude. My interactions with him became to change. I became more patient with his nagging, or should I say his attitude towards me changed and nagged me less because I listened to his corrections. One incident bear witness to the power of the Holy Spirit. It happened one morning when my father wanted to give me advice about something I did. He began the customary address once he has grown to develop some respect for my feelings and not wanting to offend me, he would say, "Don't be offended when I say this to you..." But for some odd reason, I was not in the mood to get corrected that day and I wasn't feeling the Holy Spirit working in me, I wanted my father to know what I was thinking, and I told him to "please allow me to make my own decisions and if I needed help, I would seek his advice." And I reminded him of what he always told us to do things on our own and only seek help if it's really necessary. That didn't really go well with him, and I saw his face turn red and change from an expression of concern to one of anger. And he responded with a voice that is more of dismay and sadness, rather than anaer. He said, "That's the problem with you kids, you never appreciate what I do for you." The moment I saw my father's expression and heard what he said, I realized that I made a mistake and was quickly convicted by the Holy Spirit. So I asked God for forgiveness and prayed in my heart for what I should do. He said, "Ask him for forgiveness, go give him a hug, and tell him 'I love you and I appreciate everything you have done for me." My pride wanted to say "No", and insisted that I walk out of the room, in anger, and storm out of the house, and slam the door as hard as I could to show my rebellion and hate. But the power of the Holy Spirit was greater that day, and He moved me to go up to my father, give him a big hug, kiss him on the cheek, and tell him "I loved him and appreciated everything he has done for me." I asked him for forgiveness. On that moment, I witnessed a miracle. I felt the tension from my father's whole body relax and he began to cry, and embraced me back. My relationship with my father began to transform after that memorable day. I saw my father's love for me began to grow. Not that his love was never there, it was because I responded in love that he felt comfortable to show me his love.

Adult Faith Formation in the Parish

"Come Down Zacchaeus" is the theme of our parish program that our Pastor Fr. Tony is leading us to *reimagine* in order "to bring" the faith home." How to make this happen is by becoming an "adult parish."

"Becoming and Being" an adult parish would take a big leap on the part of "all" adults. The adults who are involved in the lives of the children and youth in the parish. Parents, godparents, catechists, and other parish volunteers involved in different ministries.

Becoming and being Church would mean to go back to the basic teachings of the Church. These teachings might have been overlooked for many years especially for those baptized during infancy. Thus, all are invited to "Come Down, Zacchaeus,"

St. Lorenzo Ruiz parish continue to move forward like a boat powerfully propelled by two oars (Fr. Tony). One on the right, that is the 'discovery and rediscovery' of our Faith. This "oar" is Learning and 'relearning' what we believe (Creed), how we celebrate what we believe (Sacraments), how do we live our lives because of what we believe - (Morality) and how do we cradle enrich this faith believing life through our Prayers and Devotions. The oar on the left, is using the "Word Among Us", a liturgical guide and make the Word Made Flesh. We understand the Word by and through the very story of our own lives. With Jesus Christ living and growing within our hearts and minds through His words, the Spirit and Life within us will be like a fire to ignite a drooping spirit.

Goal: To re-evangelize the adults involve in the lives of the children and youth in the parish. Parents, godparents, sponsors, catéchists, and other parish volunteers involved in different ministries.

Method/Format: Five sessions- Two hours per session (to be fine funed).

The truth is that Jesus died for all our sins (took our sins with Him on the cross). All would include past, present, and future. That is what Jesus had to do so God can grace us with salvation, meaning we can now go to heaven only if we truly believe in Jesus. So that means Jesus took all Hitler's sins, all the rapists' sins, terrorists' sins, and every sin you can think of. Wow! That is how much God loves us. God sent Jesus to die on the cross for all our sins and for all our sickness. The concept of God punishing us ended (old covenant) when Jesus died on the cross. In John 8: 1-11 A woman caught in adultery showed me that Jesus did not condemn the woman but told her not to sin anymore. The reason Jesus did not condemn her was that Jesus would take the punishment for her at the cross.

Ever since the pandemic began, I started to read the Bible more. Searching to know more about God and His goodness. One of the things I learned is that God is love and His love for us never ceases. It is only when we sin, we choose to stop receiving God's love. It is like Wi-Fi signal. If we are out of range, we do not receive the signal. It's not that the signal stopped but we are too far away to get the signal. It is only when we truly experience God's love then we can love others the same way. How can we give unconditional love unless we experience it first? And when we do, we will begin to love others without thinking about and even more than when we tried to love. Loving others unconditionally will be a byproduct of knowing God's love for us.

Lastly to know God's love we must learn from Jesus (no one can come to the Father except through me- John 14:6). The Parable of the Sower (Mark 4:1-8) is the key. We must stick to the word and not with our feelings. As Jesus said, the cares of the world, the deceitfulness of riches, and lust for other things choke the Word. If you look up from the altar you will see a banner and it states "In the beginning was the Word..." We should start looking from the Word... the word of God.
